Looking back to the league game at Peterborough on Saturday, I thought we exorcised a few ghosts, having lost their last season.

There was a lot of chat from their direction over the fact they had beaten us at their place last season. They were harping on about it but it didn't matter. It just showed me that they saw us as a big club to play against and it was a scalp for them.

WELCOME TO THE LAMB

St Ives Town is a club steeped in history having been formed following a meeting at the Unicorn Hotel in September 1887 and is now enjoying life as a step three side after some positive years.

A group of 40 people decided to form a club under Association Rules with membership subscription of 3 Shillings and Sixpence including an entrance fee of 1 Shilling to be paid in advance. The kit was chosen to be black with a white star.

The club rose to success by the turn of the century, collecting both Huntingdonshire Senior and Junior Cups in 1901.

The Senior Cup was won again in 1912 but the club's most successful era was the twenties. The Cambridgeshire League was won on three successive occasions from 1923 to 1925, there were Hunts Senior Cup successes in 1923 and 1926 with the Scott-Gatty Cup won in 1923 and 1924. Honours continued to be won in the thirties with the Senior Cup (1930), Scott-Gatty Cup (1932) and Peterborough League Championship (1938) all won.

In 1949, the Saints joined the Central Amateur League but 12 months later the club decided to move into the UCL Second Division. The team struggled and two years later they rejoined the Peterborough League.

The Scott-Gatty Cup was won in 1961 but league fortunes plummeted as the Saints slid down to the Peterborough League Third Division. They won that division in 1978 and then won speedy promotions in the following years. This culminated with a Division One title earning a Premier Division place in 1982. Three years later St Ives moved back into the UCL.

Huntingdonshire Senior Cup successes were recorded in 1982, 1987 and 1988 while the revival of the Premier Cup saw the Saints reach the first final in 1989, losing 3-0 to Cambridge United. They also reached the Premier Cup final in 1997 and 1998, losing 5-4 to Potton and 2-1 to Biggleswade Town respectively.

After finishing next to bottom in Division One in 2002, St Ives enjoyed improved fortunes under the management of Warren Everdell and Jez Hall. A memorable 2004-05 campaign saw the Saints finish third in Division One to win promotion to the top flight for the first time in their history.

The Saints produced another record-breaking season in 2007-08 with the club's highest pyramid finish, a fifth-place finish.

In 2008-09, the club made it to the fifth round of the FA Vase for the second year running, coming sixth in the UCL Premier, and reaching the League Cup semi-final. The club reached all three county cup finals, winning the Senior and Premier Cup, losing the final of the Hinchingbrooke Cup thus stopping another remarkable treble.

The 2009/10 campaign saw the Saints make the fifth round of the FA Vase while winning the UCL League Cup for the first time in the club's history beating Newport Pagnell Town 2-1 in the final. The 2011/12 campaign saw the Saints record their most successful season to date with a third-place finish in the UCL Premier Division.

After reaching the UCL KO Cup Final for the third successive year, the Saints lifted the trophy for the second time after an impressive 4-1 victory over promoted Kings Lynn Town.

They lifted the Hunts Senior Challenge Cup to round off an excellent season with arguably one of the best squads to grace Westwood Road. Conor Washington finished the UCL and Club top goal scorer with 52 goals from 50 games. Once again the Saints saw their FA Vase dream shattered but this time after reaching the Quarter Final.

In 2012-13 the Saints were promoted to Step Four of the non-league pyramid for the first time club's 125 -year history as they finished in second place behind Holbeach United.

In the same season, striker Washington was sold to Newport County in the Football League. During the season, Warren Everdell and Jez Hall achieved their 500th game in charge together as comanagers, eventually standing down at the end of the 2013-14 campaign after an incredible 12 years at the helm.

The 2014/15 season saw the new management team of Ricky Marheineke and Jack Cassidy take over the first-team squad and leading them to a respectable ninth position.

2015/16 saw the team exceed all expectations by achieving promotion to step three of the football pyramid for the first time in their history as they turned over Rushden and Diamonds in the play-off final front of a bumper crowd of over 1500 at the Pro-Edge Stadium. A late Danny Watson equalizer topped off by a winner from local lad Ben Seymour-Shove in extra time finished off a fantastic season.

A 15th place finish followed in 2016-17 but they enjoyed their best-ever run in the FA Trophy getting to the third qualifying round before falling to a single goal at Kings Lynn Town.

2017/18 saw the Ives handed a lifeline as they finished 22nd but were saved by the reorganization of the Leagues.

They responded superbly in 2018-19 as they enjoyed their most successful season ever finishing 13th in the Southern League Premier Division Central while reaching the third qualifying round of the FA Cup. The season that never was saw the Saint on the edge of the drop zone but having just started a run of results that looked likely to pull them away from their precarious position.

This season has started with a win and they will be looking to build on it this afternoon ...

IN OPPOSITION (I)

Ricky Marheineke (Manager)

Ricky is entering his seventh season as manager of St Ives Town. During his first season he took the club to a ninth place finish in Southern League Division One Central beating the previous year's points tally, and in his second season secured a memorable promotion, guiding The Ives to a play-off extra time win over AFC Rushden & Diamonds. In his first season at step three he continued to take the club forward finishing a creditable 15th in the Premier Division also enjoying a run to the League Challenge Cup Final which unfortunately ended in defeat. A tough season in 2017/18 was followed in 2018/19 by the club's most successful season ever finishing 13th.



Gary Mills (Player/Coach)

Gary is a midfielder who has had successful spells at Rushden & Diamonds, Crawley Town, Kettering Town, Stevenage Borough, Mansfield Town and Lincoln City. He also had a short stint with the Lambs.

His achievements as a player include winning the FA Trophy and league winners medals from the Conference North, Conference Premier and the Football League third division. A UEFA A licence coach, he has also managed at Rugby Town and Corby Town.

THE TEAM

Martin Conway (Goalkeeper)

Experienced keeper Martin joined the Ives in November 2018 from Kempston Rovers having been virtually an ever present for The Walnut Boys over past two seasons. Having first joined Kempston in their UCL days in 2010 he has enjoyed much success with them appearing over 300 times in two stints with the Club. His other previous clubs include Aylestone Park, Leicester Constabulary, Hinckley United and Ampthill Town.

Ben Jackson (Defender)

The former Northampton Town youngster was released by the Cobblers at the end of 2014/15 season and joined Rugby Town where a serious injury put him out of the game for a while. After a stint with West Widnes FC, he grabbed the opportunity to rejuvenate his football career with the Ives and is a vital cog at the club.

Oran Jackson (Defender)

Oran has played first team football for MK Dons, featuring as a substitute against Nottingham Forest in 2016. He remained on MK Dons books until summer of 2019 but moved to Iceland to play top tier football for IBV making nine appearances in the early part of the season. Moving back to the UK he played for Billericay Town in the National League South before joining Ives.

Ben Toseland (Defender/Midfield)

Having learnt his trade in the youth and academy teams at Northampton Town, he made his debut for Kettering at St Ives in a 4-3 win for the Poppies in September 2017. On leaving Kettering he joined local rivals Peterborough Sports at the start of 2019/20 season and had made ten appearances for the Turbines this season prior to joining Ives in November 2019.

Kyle Lincoln (Defender)

The left-sided defender Kyle has joined the lves in the summer from fellow Southern League Premier Central outfit Bromsgrove Sporting. His previous list of clubs include Barton Rovers, Dunstable Town, Berkhamsted and Hitchin Town.

Jarvis Wilson (Defender)

Twenty-year-old Jarvis is a quick and powerful centre back who joined the lves at start of 2018/19 season having completed a scholarship at Northampton Town.

IN OPPOSITION (2)

Bailey Baker (Defender)

Exciting young full back Bailey was discovered in local football and was a regular in lves reserves last season in Cambridgeshire County league. He has shown his ability in both attack and defence during pre-season and has deservedly earnt himself the chance to stake a regular starting place in lves line up this season.

Jordan Patrick (Defender/Midfield)

Former Cambridge United professional Jordan has a wealth of knowledge at our level and brings valuable experience both on and off the pitch. He joined from Biggleswade Town and former former Clubs include Bury Town, Bedford Town, Needham Market and St Neots Town.

Dylan Williams (Midfield)

Dylan spent his formative years in the academy at Cambridge United eventually winning himself a professional contract with the U's. He only made one appearance for the first team whilst at the Abbey Stadium but that was a memorable one appearing in the hosts record 7-0 thrashing of Morecambe in April 2016. Released by the U's in summer 2017 he joined Ives local Southern League rivals St Neots Town where he spent almost two full seasons scoring 18 goals in 61 appearances. Since then he has had spells at Lowestoft Town and Biggleswade Town where he finished last season.

Nathan Hicks (Midfield)

Nathan learnt his trade at Leicester City and has more recently been an integral part of the rise of AFC Rushden & Diamonds where he has been an almost ever present over the last two seasons making a total of 83 appearances for the Diamonds. He also has a wealth of National League experiences listing Histon, AFC Learnington and Alfreton Town amongst his former clubs. Closer to home he has also enjoyed successful spells at Kettering Town and Biggleswade Town.

Robbie Parker (Midfield)

Robbie joined the Ives in the summer of 2018 from fellow Southern League club Biggleswade Town having spent two seasons as an ever present in the Waders very competitive side. The hard working and energetic midfield player was quickly made club captain and we instantly saw why as he showed an amazing level of consistency and always lead by example only missing one game throughout 2018/19 season's highly successful campaign and a similar number prior to the early curtailment of last season. He is very much the engine of the side.

Edmund Hottor (Midfield)

Edmund is a 27 year-old Ghanaian midfielder who made three senior appearances for Italian side Triestina before joining AC Milan in January 2010. Whilst never making a senior appearance for the Italian giants in his six years at the club he had loan spells with lower level Italian sides Lanciano, Nocerina and Venezia. In January 2016 he signed for Inter Milan and had loan spells with Portuguese sides Athletico CP and AD Fafe before playing 2017/18 season for Maltese club Sliema Wanderers. Had a brief spell with Kettering Town in 2018/19 before joining Banbury United in November 2018. He has been out of the game for while with injury but now fit again he is raring to restart his career with lyes.

Seth Patrick (Midfield)

20 year old Seth has recently returned to the UK from Germany where he was playing for fourth tier side Phonix Lubeck. He began his career at Northampton Town but not winning a professional contract at the end of his scholarship programme he moved to Germany in October 2018 where he played in the under 19 sides at both Germania Schwanheim and VfB Lubeck. During his time with the latter club he received the honour of being called up to represent his country of birth Zimbabwe in an Africa Cup of Nations under 23 tie with Mozambique.

Dan Clifton (Midfield)

Dan joined the Ives in summer 2019. The 23-year-old former Northampton Town professional is a classy midfielder who spent the previous season with AFC Rushden & Diamonds making 13 step three appearances for the Diamonds. He has also previously appeared for Hitchin Town, Harefield United, Biggleswade Town and AFC Kempston Rovers.

In opposition (3)

Ben Seymour-Shove (Winger)

Ben returned to his home town club having left in the latter stages of 2017/18 season to bolster Cambridge City's promotion push. He is now entering his sixth season with the club. having previously worked with the manager at Huntingdon Town following his Scholarship with Peterborough United. Local boy Ben will always be remembered for scoring the winning goal in the play-off final against AFC Rushden and Diamonds. He continues to have a happy knack of coming up with vital goals just when they are needed

Nabil Shariff (Striker)

Prolific striker Nabil has moved around a number of clubs at National League and Southern League level scoring goals wherever he has gone. Most recently he has rattled in 42 goals in 73 appearances over two seasons for AFC Rushden & Diamonds prior to that he had registered 14 goals in half a season at St Neots Town and can also list Alfreton Town, Kettering Town, Oxford City, Banbury United, Tamworth and Stratford Town amongst his former clubs.

Arel Amu (Striker)

Arel joined the Ives in the summer from local rivals Cambridge City where he scored seven times in 21 starting appearances last season. His development years were spent on Luton Town's books where he played his part in the Hatters run to the third round of FA Youth Cup in 2013/14 bagging a few goals along the way. After leaving the professional ranks he joined Welling United before moving on to enjoy a very successful spell at Dunstable Town. This led to him being snapped up by National League outfit Hemel Hempstead Town where he bagged six goals in 14 games before moving on to Walton Casuals and then in the summer of 2019 the Lillywhites.

Dylan Wilson (Striker)

Dýlan spent 2017/18 with Rushden and Higham United in the United Counties League where he hit 35 goals in 40 games in his first season of men's football. It did not take him long to find the net for Ives either scoring the winner at Lowestoft in only his second game. Unfortunately, he picked up a broken ankle that curtailed his progress. The youngster has a bright future ahead of him and showed he can still pick up goals with a run of four goals in five games just prior to the early curtailment of last season.

Marc Richards (Striker)

Veteran striker Marc has over 600 football league appearances to his name with the excellent return of over 180 goals during that period. The ex England under 18 and under 20 international started his professional career with Blackburn Rovers and can also name Northampton Town, Chesterfield, Barnsley, Port Vale, Swindon Town and Cambridge United amongst his list of clubs. He had the honour of winning promotion with the first three of those clubs. He joins the lves after a brief spell just before the premature close of 2019/20 season at National League promotion contenders Yeovil Town where he scored two goals in seven appearances for the Glovers.

Michael Gyasi (Striker)

German born Michael spent his initial development years in the Northampton Town Centre of Excellence before joining Chelsea at the tender age of eleven. He spent two years developing his skills with the Blues before moving on to another Premier League academy at Leicester City. During his spell with the Foxes he attended an England under-15 training camp but he was eventually released in 2016. He then moved into non-league football initially at Nuneaton Borough before eventually moving back towards his roots in Northamptonshire where he has more recently represented Bedford Town, Barton Rovers and Daventry Town.

Matt Foy (Striker)

Matt joined the Ives in September 2019 from local rivals Cambridge City. The prolific striker came through the youth ranks at Cambridge United before signing a three year professional contract. During that contract period he spent spells on loan with a number of other Clubs including Lowestoft Town, St Neots Town and most notably Harlow Town where he posted 22 goals in 40 games over two spells with the Hawks.
