Right now it's all about getting results when you can and the performances will start to improve over the next few weeks.

Tonight we welcome Barwell who have some very, very good players. They have some top drawer lads to be fair, some of the best in the league in the positions they play. They are an extremely hard-working and organised side and they have a good manager in Guy Hadland. They play with desire and we will have to make sure we are equal to that.

They will have aspirations to be a play-off club this season and I don't see any reason why they can't be a top-five side if I am being honest.

I am expecting another tough home fixture. If we are on our game we will do well but if we are not on our game then we will be punished.

Let's just hope, for all the excitement, we are not 2-1 down this time with eight minutes to go! Hopefully it will be an exciting game for the fans though.

Enjoy the evening and we wish Barwell a safe journey home afterwards.

The men are quickly back in action here on Saturday in the Emirates FA Cup versus Southern Football League Division One South & West side Evesham United, kick off 3pm with £3,375 prize money for the winners, and £1,125 for the losers.

Then on Sunday our women's side entertain Dronfield Ladies in the Vitality Women's FA Cup, also here at The Lamb, kick off 2 pm. Prize money is £400 / 100 respectively to the winners / losers. Entrance on Sunday is £2 adults with juniors free and we would love to see you here.



### WELCOME TO THE LAMB

Barwell FC played for the first time in the Midland Combination in the 1992/3 season when Barwell Athletic from the Leicestershire Senior League joined forces with Hinckley FC. They became one of the founder members of the Midland Football Alliance League on its formation in 1994/95 with its sports complex including bowling and cricket.

Floodlights were installed prior to the 1992/93 season and have been updated to comply with current FA lighting regulations.

A covered stand was built prior to 1996/7 season and during the 1997/8 close season the ground was enclosed.

Towards the end of 2000/01 season a new 250 seat cantilever stand was erected at Kirkby Road, and officially opened by former Liverpool goalkeeper Chris Kirkland in July 2001.

Bob Steel, took over the reins at Barwell in February 2004 and instilled his way of playing into the players.

By 2005/6, the club put some silverware in the cabinet as they won the Polymac Services League Cup final at Walsall's Bescot Stadium, beating Leamington 3-1.

The 2006/7 campaign saw Barwell finish sixth in the table and finish runners up in both the Westerby Cup and the Rolleston Charity Cup.

During 2007/08, manager Steel stood down to take on the running of the Sports Bar on the complex and his assistant Ian Blyth took over as manager. After a run of indifferent results and the team slipping toward the bottom three, a familiar name to Tamworth fans - Marcus Law -(pictured while at The Lamb) took the reins.

A run of good result lifted the club to a respectable mid-table finish before 2008/9 brought success.

They finished runners up in the League on 91 points and also won the Westerby Cup beating Quorn 2-0 at the Walkers Stadium. Barwell had started

the new season on a high by lifting the Joe McGorrian trophy at Market Drayton by beating the home team 4-0.

Success bred success and 2009/10 saw the club win the Joe McGorian Cup at 2008/9 league winners Market Drayton.

In the league, Barwell won the league and promotion to The Evo-Stik Northern Premier League, winning the division in style, finishing unbeaten, playing 42 games, winning 36 and drawing six, amassing a League record 114 points. They also scored 125 goals and conceded only 18. Law also led them to the semi-finals of the FA Vase, losing in the last minute of the second leg to the eventual cup winners, Whitley Bay.

Law left the following season for a full-time post at Kettering Town and assistant manager Paul O'Brien took over until he had to stand down due to work commitments.

Enter Jimmy Ginnelly, now Nuneaton boss, who won the Evo Stik Division 1 South at the first attempt. The team finished a creditable ninth in their first season in the Premier Division and during the 2012/13 campaign sat in the top five for the major part of the season and eventually finished eighth.

In 2013/14, Barwell were moved from the Southern League back to the Northern Premier League and finished in a creditable 14th position before finishing seventh the season afterwards. They also had a good FA Cup and Trophy run and topped the season off when they won the Westerby Challenge Trophy at the King Power stadium beating neighbours Coalville Town 2-1 with goals from Nigel Julian and Jamie Hood.

Ginnelly's men finished a creditable ninth in the league in 2015/16 after a great run in January and February where they had 12 straight wins.

In 2016/17, a poor start saw Barwell finish 14th at the end of the season and the highlight was winning the Leicestershire Challenge Cup at The King Power Stadium, beating Coalville Town. After finishing ninth in the 2017/18 campaign, Barwell were moved to the new Southern League Central Premier League with Ginnelly deciding to move the Nuneaton.

Assistant manager Guy Hadland took over and brought in the experienced Martin Sockett. They followed up a 16th place finish with an improved campaign in 2019/20 - the season that wasn't. When Covid-19 forced the end of the campaign, Barwell sat 12th and will be looking to kick on from that this season.

### IN OPPOSITION (I)

#### Max Bramley (Goalkeeper)

Max joined Barwell in October 2019 from the Leicester City youth team. He kept three clean sheets in his first three games and cemented the number one jersey las season.

#### Liam Castle (Goalkeeper)

The experienced Liam has been with Barwell for over 13 seasons and shot-stopping antics have earnt him many. His career started at Basingstoke Town and he also featured for Hinckley United.

#### Mason Birch (Defender)

An exciting full-back, Mason started out as an Aston Villa Youth player. He has also played for Redditch United, Kidderminster Harriers and Worcester City before joining Barwell in the summer of 2020.

#### Eddy Nisevic (Defender)

Eddy has been at Barwell since 2014 and was at Brackley Town prior to joining the Canaries. A dependable left back for many seasons, he missed nearly all of the 2019/20 season with a knee injury.

#### Elliott Percival (Defender)

The former Leicester City and Sheffield Wednesday defender signed for Barwell in summer 2018 and has not looked back. Able to play at right back or centre back.

#### Eliot Putman (Defender)

Eliot is in his third season as a defender with the club and his pace and attacking ability has made him a fans' favourite. Suffered from a fractured spine in pre-season but will be looking to get back to being a regular name on the team sheet soon.

#### Jayden Cotterill (Defender)

From 2014-2018 Jayden was a scholar and had a year pro at Burton Albion Football Club, which gave him the chance to train with the England national side. After being released, the opportunity to play college football in America fell through, and he joined Barwell before the 2019/20 season. Can play at right back or centre back.

#### Owen Bennett (defender)

Young defender Owen has had time at Solihull Moors, Coventry United and AFC Telford United

#### Leandro Browne (Midfield)

Signed for Barwell in the summer of 2020 having been at Coalville Town previously. His previous clubs include Burton Albion, Loughborough Dyamo and Oadby Town. Leandro is a versatile midfield player who can play out wide or more centrally.

### In opposition (2)

#### Micah Edwards (Midfield)

Micah joined in summer 2019. A former youth player for Derby County, he has spent time with Ilkeston Town and Gresley. Made a real impact in his first season with Barwell and will be one to keep an eye on in 2020/21.

#### Brady Hickey (Midfield)

The team captain re-joined Barwell after a brief spell at Nuneaton Borough in 2018/19 and led the team well last season. A skilful player who can also be combative in the middle of the pitch. He is well known for his ability to score goals and take excellent free kicks.

#### Nigel Julien (Midfield)

Nigel has returned to Barwell after a season away at Nuneaton Borough. He had played 11 years prior to his departure in the summer of 2019 and was known for his tenacious, energetic play and winning attitude. Nigel began his career with Coventry City before a spell with Quorn.

#### Tristan Dunkley (Midfielder)

Tristan is an experienced player who can light up a game with real skill and attacking energy. He likes to make himself a nuisance up front and can score some spectacular goals. Has featured for Tamworth (pictured), Alvechurch and Worcester City amongst others.

#### Sam Hollis (Striker)

Sam signed from Oadby Town, having also played for St

Andrews and Quorn. He is in his second spell with Barwell and looking to cement a starting position this season.

#### Kai Williams (Striker)

Pacey winger signed from Tamworth in October 2019 and has had spells with Stratford Town and Coventry United. A really electrifying winger on his day with the ability to change a game on his own. He pops up with important goals through the season.

#### Massiah McDonald (Striker)

A Montserratian footballer, Massiah re-joined Barwell in summer 2020. He made his international debut for Montserrat in March 2015. A youth player for Notts County with plenty of experience.

#### Jahvan Davidson-Miller (Striker)

Jahvan is just returning from a long-term injury. A former youth player for Derby County, he made 15 appearances for them in the under-18 Premier League and has a good eye for goal.


