They will want a reaction while we will want to continue the good form we have been in and no one will want to lose before a potential month break!

Normally, when you lose the next game is not far away and you can put it right but losing this one, we might have a month to stew over it and I will get a month of grief from people I know at Stratford! For personal pride, it'll give me something to be interested in during the lockdown if we do beat them! I expect a tough game and it's like any game in this league, every club has their moments and we win well but they will be thinking the same.

We just want to put on a show and if it is going into lockdown, we just move on and prepare for whenever the next game will be.

In terms of Stratford, as a former club of mine, I hear from most people there. I left them amicably and I still speak to the players and management there. It's a fantastic club with a good set up great fan base, some really nice people involved and I enjoyed my time there. I'd actually taken the decision to retire and not get involved anymore when they convinced me to come back.

If they hadn't done that, I wouldn't be at Tamworth today so it's all a knock on effect. I will always be thankful to them but obviously hope The Lambs are on the right end of the scoreline this evening!

Farewell to a Lambs managerial legend

We were sadly informed that former Lambs boss Hughie Morrow passed away last week and we would like to send our condolences to his family and friends.

Hughie took charge of the club between February 1967 and September 1971. His managerial record speaks for itself, P 314 W 183 D 60 L 71. Only Paul Hendrie (351) has managed more games, while only Graham Smith and the current management team have better win percentages. Although never leading The Lambs to a league title or promotion he

steered us to Birmingham Senior Cup victory, three Staffs Senior Cup Finals and one League Cup Final. He will be remembered mainly for the success enjoyed in the FA Cup, reaching the 1st Round in 1970-71 to face the might of York City (and taking them to a replay) after having reached the second round in 1969-70. his side performed heroics to defeat Torquay United 2-1 at home victory before the FA Cup trail ended away to Gillingham. This was the further the side had ever reached in the competition and it remained a club record until 2005-06 when we travelled to, and beat, Hartlepool United in the second round to face Stoke City in the third.

Women triumph over Vale

Ryan Hamilton's Women's side recorded another storming victory in the West Midland Regional League Division One North courtesy of eight goals without reply on Sunday afternoon here at the CR MOT Community Stadium at The Lamb.

Aimee Walker got the goalfest underway with just 12 seconds on the clock and completed her hat-trick in the 76th minute with other goals coming from Grace Dickens (2), Ella Spears, Chloe Finn and Charlotte Reinforth.

Lighting Up the Lamb


The view of the Lamb is about to change as the 9 trademark floodlight columns, which tend to be the first sighting of the ground as you drive in to the Town Centre, will soon disappear having now been accompanied by a brand new state of the art 4 column system positioned in the 4 corners of the ground.

Tonight may well be the last 1st team game that is lit by the old floodlights.

Each new column will house the new LED lights this week which will bring a number of benefits to the club and the surrounding neighbourhood.

The current floodlights have been in place since 1969 (see news clipping right) having previously been in place at the old Scarborough ground and were proving expensive to run and maintain.

We had to go through a lengthy grant application process with the Football Foundation who have agreed to fund 70% of the project through the Football Stadia Improvement Fund and we are also incredibly grateful to Mario Gouci, Gordan Hargrave, Martin Leckie, Jim McCarthy, Tom Pegg, Jack Smith, Andrew Turland, together with some people who made anonymous



donations which has enabled us to make progress with this important project which is vital to the future of The Lamb



We are working with Birmingham based company Flick Lighting and when completed, the club will benefit from a new sustainable system that will improve the facilities offered to the local community in Tamworth and the surrounding area.


The lights housed on 4 columns will be dimmable using mobile technology and will be similar to those at Leicester City's new training ground as well as at Wrexham FC and Barnsley FC.

They will be fully focused on the pitch, thus reducing the current light spillage that impacts local housing and road junctions and the new system will reduce the club's running and maintenance costs as well as improve our carbon footprint.

With the ground now in use 7 days a week, it provides a valuable resource for the local community where hundreds of young people and adults regularly use the facility. It has taken a lot of hard work to get this in place and we are very excited that very soon we will see the completion of this project for the benefit of future generations of Lambs.

Moving to a Cashless Stadium

The Covid pandemic has seen many changes to the way we go about our daily lives. One area that has changed quite drastically is our use of cash. There are now many places that will only accept the use of a card or your mobile device in order to reduce the spread of the virus. It is no different for us here at the Lamb, however, with the guidelines that have been enforced on us to enable a maximum of 600 supporters to return to the Lamb, there is plenty of work for us to do.



The technology required to enable a totally cashless stadium requires an online ticket portal, a high quality broadband connection and point to point wifi across the ground linking the offices, advanced QR readers at the turnstiles, offices, community areas and card readers.

We have made the first move with the online ticket portal. This provides supporters with the convenience of purchasing tickets in advance to secure their place at the game and also ensure the club has all the details required for the Government's track and trace programme. It is our intention to open a matchday ticket office, hopefully this weekend, and once we have completed the installation of the new technologies we will we will be selling tickets and asking supporters to install the NHS, or our own, app or supply their details to ensure track and trace.

Card payments will then also become the preferred payment method for the VIP lounge, clubhouse and food outlets around the ground.

Buying tickets online is a simple process at https://thelambs.ktckts.com Purchasing match tickets takes less than 2 minutes, with e-tickets delivered in PDF format via email, which you can either print off and just use your smartphone for scanning at the turnstiles.

You will need to create an account on the ticketing portal to purchase your tickets. If purchasing a ticket on the site on behalf of another family member/friend etc. after clicking on ASSIGN ATTENDEES, then click on EDIT DETAILS to provide the name of the person using the other ticket for track and trace purposes.



After clicking CONFIRM & PAY you will have one final chance to check everything is in order before making your credit or debit card payment.

After completing your ticket purchase, you will receive an order confirmation by email, quickly followed by the tickets on a separate e-mail as a PDF attachment, both sent from BOX OFFICE. Either print the tickets off or download the match tickets PDF to your smartphone and present it at the turnstile.

We will keep supporters updated via the program and website about our continued move to a cashless stadium. The new broadband system will also bring match day benefits for supporters too - watch this space for future announcements!

JAS' 100km CHALLENGE

As we approach another lockdown, our mental health is set to be tested to the hilt once again.

So the timing of Tamworth keeper Jas Singh's new charity challenge couldn't be more appropriate.

As a fitness instructor, who knows the benefits exercise has on our mental as well as physical well-being, Jas is passionate about charities such as MIND.

And as a result, he's hoping to raise funds for the charity with a new 100km Challenge.

"My friend Conor McManus and I started a business, Collective Fitness, a couple of years ago now," he explained. "We have come up with a fitness app that we plan to launch to coincide with a charity event we will do.

"Fitness tends to be sex sells where everyone wants six packs, biceps etc but we want to move away from that and promote the fact you can live a healthy lifestyle without looking pristine all the time. We want people to feel good, mentally and physically."

He added: "So while we are promoting that we want to raise some money for MIND and we agreed to do 100km in one day so it will be a 50km row and 50km run. "We will do a 5k row, 5k run and alternate between the two on the day.

"It was due to be November 29 but we'll have to see what restrictions are in place.

"It means a lot to us, the charity, as people but also as a business and we try to highlight and promote the mental health side of fitness."

"More now than ever, men speak about their mental health. Even at non-league level, people don't realise how mental health can be affected.

"It is a ruthless business and sometimes it can be a hard place especially for young footballers who get a reality check and don't understand why things aren't working straight away.

"It can be cut throat because you can lose your job instantly whereas at the top level of the game you are contracted and have a secure income.

"I know young lads who only have this as a job so when it's taken away it can be difficult at times.

"Touch wood, we are looking to raise £5000 and we want to get some traction on it so hopefully I can get some support from Tamworth fans."

Meanwhile, Jas has been satisfied with the way the Lambs have started the campaign.

"We have shown a real spirit," said Singh. "We have come back in more games already this season than last year.

"It's been hard but the fact we are still getting results when we are not playing as great can only be positive.

"We want to play a certain way and the new lads have to get used to that but the fact we haven't had a settled XI, which we haven't had all season, has affected that. It has been taken out of our control with injuries and coronavirus. Hopefully things will be able to return to some kind of normality soon and we will be able get some continuity and can settle into a pattern."

A Look Back on Saturday's Action in the Buildbase FA Trophy involving Pitching In Southern League Premier Central Clubs

There were several `upsets` in Saturday`s Buildbase FA Trophy Third Qualifying Round involving Pitching In Southern Football League clubs. A crowd of 482 at the Victoria Ground saw Division One Central side and close neighbours Coleshill Town inflict a 1-0 defeat on hosts Bromsgrove Sporting. Despite dominating large parts of the game, Sporting lost to an 88th minute James Harrison goal for the Colemen.

Two Premier Division Central sides, Stourbridge and tonight's visitors Stratford Town, were beaten at home by teams from the Northern Premier League Division One South East. The Glassboys were comprehensively beaten 3-0 at the War Memorial Athletic Ground. A crowd of 572 saw Tom Siddons put Stamford in front after just 8 minutes. Tendai Chitiza then doubled the visitors` lead 10 minutes before the break. And the home side`s misery was complete when they had Brad Birch dismissed for a second bookable offence in the 82nd minute with Rob Morgan added a third for Stamford from the penalty spot in the 89th minute.

Kidsgrove Athletic won 3-1 at The Arden Garages Stadium against Stratford, who found themselves a goal down inside the opening 4 minutes to a Kingsley Adu-Gyamfi effort. Lewis Burgin then added a second for Grove in the 10th minute. Things settled down after that until Kyle Diskin converted a 66th-minute penalty to virtually kill off the tie as a contest, although Ashley Sammons did manage a consolation for the hosts in the 76th minute..

League compatriots Biggleswade Town, Hitchin Town, Lowestoft Town, Needham Market, Peterborough Sports, Royston Town, St Ives Town, Kings Langley, Nuneaton Borough and Leiston, who won 4-2 on penalties after an amazing 4-4 draw at Victory Road against Isthmian Premier Division Worthing are all through to the next round

Biggleswade edged through 1-0 at Langford Road against Isthmian North outfit Heybridge Swifts, thanks to a 56th minute Connor Furlong effort.

Hitchin won 3-1 at Top Field against Isthmian South East side Herne Bay, who led after just 8 minutes through Zak Ansah. Lewis Barker took the Canaries into the break all-square with a 34th-minute leveller and then Alex Marsh put them ahead 3 minutes after the interval, with Callum Stead adding a third with 6 minutes remaining.

Kieran Higgs bagged a brace and Connor Parsons the other as Lowestoft saw off Isthmian Premier side Lewes 3-1 at Crown Meadow – Gary Noel netting an 82nd minute consolation.

Lewes's Sussex neighbours, Isthmian South East outfit Three Bridges, suffered a 4-1 defeat at Bloomfields against Needham Market. Ben Fowkes after 32 minutes and Noah Collard 4 minutes later gave the Marketmen a cushion that Joe Marsden added to 3 minutes after half-time. Tom Tolfrey reduced the arrears in the 56th minute and Bridges then had Dean Lovegrove sent-off for a deliberate handball in the 74th minute and Marsden converted the spot-kick to make the final score 4-1.

Peterborough Sports enjoyed a 4-2 Bee Arena success over Northern Premier League Premier Division Gainsborough Trinity. The hosts got off to a good start with a 4th minute Josh Moreman goal and then defender Paul Malone popped up to make it 2-0 in the 17th minute. However, Trinity fought back to pull level through Simon Ainge after 34 minutes and then AJ Greaves 9 minutes into the second period. Maniche Sani quickly restored the home side's lead 2 minutes later and then an own goal by debutant Matt Baker on 66 minutes sealed Sports' progress.

A Brandon Adams brace in the 24th minute from the spot and then 44th minute from open play sealed Royston's passage at Garden Walk against Isthmian South East side Hythe Town.

St Ives, however, needed penalties to overcome former Trophy winners Stafford Rangers at Westwood Road. The 1972 and 1979 winners looked like going through when they led through Joe Cuff's 13th-minute goal going into the last minute. But the side in caretaker manager charge after the departure of Jody Banim in midweek, conceded an 89th-minute leveller from Dylan Williams. And Rangers lost the shoot-out 4-1.

Kings Langley enjoyed a more comfortable 4-1 win at The Orbital Fasteners Stadium against Isthmian Premier Division visitors Brightlingsea Regent. Goals from Brad Wadkins after 18 minutes and Saul Williams on the half-hour mark gave the home side a 2-0 interval lead. Williams` second came just 4 minutes after the restart and Jack Wood finished the Essex side off with a fourth on 65 minutes, although they did manage a Lewis Byrne-Hewitt consolation 12 minutes from the end.

Nuneaton survived a potential banana skin at the Lyme Valley Stadium against Northern Premier Division One South East hosts Newcastle Town. It was goalless at the break, but then Marcus Kelly broke the deadlock on 57 minutes and Devon Kelly-Evans added a second just 4 minutes later to seal the win.

Here at The Lamb, Tamworth took the lead against Banbury United on 36 minutes with a Shaquille McDonald header. Just 4 minutes later it was 2-0 when McDonald slotted home after running onto a through ball. Former Lamb Jaanai Gordon reduced the arrears on 76 minutes, but Banbury were unable to find a leveller.

Rushall Olympic eased through 4-1 at Dales Lane against Barwell with a Ricardo Dudley own goal after 21 minutes giving the hosts a helping hand. Sam Hollis equalised soon after the

break, but Rackeem Reid, Sam Whittall and new signing Danny Glover added further goals for the hosts

Alvechurch went out 2-1 at Greenwich
Avenue against Northern Premier
League Premier Division hosts
Basford United. All the goals came in
the final 4 minutes, with Wayde Hines
and Marcus Marshall giving the
Nottinghamshire side a 2-0 lead
before Keiron Cook replied.

Nantwich Town edged out Redditch by the odd goal in five at the Trico Stadium. Callum Saunders broke the deadlock to give the Dabbers the lead 4 minutes into the second half. Tom Hillman equalised 4 minutes later, only for Prince Haywood to restore 15 the Cheshire side's lead 3 minutes 16 afterwards. Saunders' second on 87 minutes gave the visitors wriggle 18 room, although Hillman's second in 19 stoppage time caused a few flutters.

TODAY'S VISITORS

Stratford's full club history can be found on their official website, but we take up the story in the 2008 / 2009 season which was Town's first full one at its new Knights Lane facility and expectations were high for the season ahead. A historic run in the FA Vase ended in 5th round defeat to eventual winners Whitley Bay but again league form was inconsistent. Despite a great run in the last two months Town ended in 6th place having never threatened the top three and manager Micky Moore paid the price at the end of the season. New manager Rod Brown was appointed, with the task of bringing that elusive promotion top of his list of priorities. A first season finish in third place was followed by a dismal start to the 2010 / 2011 season and by September Brown had left.

Former player Morton Titterton replaced Brown, once again a top six finish was gained, along with a fine end of season league cup win over Boldmere St Michaels.

The 2011 / 2012 season was again disappointing and Carl Adams was brought in as comanager for the 2012 / 2013 campaign. Unfortunately Morton Titterton had to relinquish his duties leaving Carl Adams in sole charge. Town went top of league in early September and remained there, at one point opening up a 19 point lead. But with the terrible winter causing fixture chaos Town secured the title with 4 games left to play thus ending their 19 season stay in the MFA and promotion to the Southern League Div 1 South & West.

The 2013/14 season saw Town finish in 10th position playing a brand of attacking football that produced 103 goals and the league's leading goalscorer in Richard Gregory with 39.

The 2014/15 season saw the majority of the previous year's squad re-signed and together with some additional signings Town made an impressive start hitting the top of the table after 10 consecutive wins. Despite a poor run of results around the turn of the year they produced a 12 match unbeaten run to secure a 3rd place finish and reach the play off's. Having overcome Taunton Town 2-1 in the semi-final they beat Lakhall Athletic in the final in front of a ground record crowd of 1054 supporters to gain promotion to the Evostik Southern Premier League.

After winning promotion to the Southern League Prem the 2015/16 season was all about consolidation. The previous season's end of season form continued with Town making a bright start to life at the highest level in their history. By Christmas Town were comfortable in mid table but a poor run of form into the new year meant a promising start turned into a 19th place finish. Mission accomplished and onto a tough second season in the Division.

2016/17 saw Town achieve their highest league position. A young developing side finished 14th and but for 14 drawn games could have been higher. The coming season sees most of last years squad re-signed, which with the addition of some new players will see Town consolidate even more in this division.

IN OPPOSITION

Tyrell Belford: The former Nuneaton Borough, Oxford City, Southport and Swindon Town keeper. He also played for Liverpool FC and represented England at the Under-17s World Cup in Mexico.

Ryan Braimbridge: The former Nuneaton keeper whose honours include winning the league with Borough's under-19s.

Jordan Williams: A commanding and cultured centre half, his former clubs include Stourbridge, Brackley Town, Cambridge United and Birmingham City.

Dan Vann: Described as an all-action versatile defender, his former club was Walsall.



Rhys Sharpe (pictured while at The Lamb): The left back started out at Derby County and went on to have spells with Notts County, Swindon, Matlock, Tamworth and Nuneaton Borough. In October 2013, Sharpe was called up by Northern Ireland U21 and made his debut in a 1-0 defeat to Belgium.

George Heaven: The Stratford central defender started his career with Leicester City.

Jimmy Fry: Hugely popular Jimmy played a major part in Stratford's record-breaking 2018-19 season which saw them reach the Southern Premier league play offs and prestigious Southern League Challenge Cup. Started at Birmingham and spent last season with Tamworth.

Enoch Andoh: The 27-year-old pacy winger began his career in his native Ghana with Hearts of Oak and King Faisal Babes before being signed up by Portuguese club FC Porto. Went on to play for Cypriot side AEL Limassol, Port Vale, Whitehawk and Nuneaton Borough.

Will Grocott: Former clubs include Aston Villa, Tamworth, Kettering and Stourbridge. The skipper is a classy, creative midfielder with an eye for goal.

Ashley Sammons: A former Solihull Moors and Birmingham City player, he represented England at under-17,18 and 19 level and is a ball-playing centre midfield.

Callum Powell: The tricky and pacey winger has enjoyed spells with Tamworth, Wrexham, Rugby Town, Northampton Town and Nuneaton Borough.

Kynan Isaac: A Stratford dangerman, his former teams include Reading, Luton Town, Banbury United and Oxford City.

Ken Feyi: A big, powerful, goal scoring centre forward who signed for Aylesbury United in summer 2019 from Aylesbury FC, having finished his university studies. He netted twice against the Ducks in the Aylesbury derby in April 2019. Joined Tamworth in early 2020 before his switch to Stratford.

Leam Howards: A speedy striker with an eye for goal, Leam's previous clubs include Kidlington, Banbury United and Coventry City.
