TAMWORTH FC 3-1 LEISTON FC

MATCH REPORT

Tamworth made three changes to the side that started at Meadow Lane with Dan Creaney not featuring, and Chris Cox, Mickey Taylor and Michael Tait all starting. The Lambs kicked off the match attacking the Castle End in the first half and went on the attack from the first whistle but Waite's cross was too long for Tait and then Mikey Taylor's shot was taken by Donkin.

Switters got himself into a good position on the right wing 5 only to curl his cross over the head of Davies in the back of the box, and it was Davies that broke the deadlock in the 9th minute converting Dunbar's low left wing cross past Singh with consummate ease (0-1, 9 mins)

Beswick tried to forge an opening from a corner on 10 but it was cleared effectively by the home defence and Leiston pushed forwards forcing a handful of flagkicks of their own. Concannon struck from inside the area but it was easy for Donkin to gather at head height on 17 and Switters had a free header from a lofted pass on 18 which fell nicely for Singh to catch. A cross from Wilder on 20 was nearly met by Taylor at the near post but he was beaten to it and Concannon's corner was headed on by Taylor but skipped out past the far post.

Beswick's freekick from the left on 23 was headed into the air by Pendley and Donkin rose highest to claim it as Tait bore down on him at the far post.

Cox worked hard to keep the ball in play on the right on 27 and found Taylor but the Leiston defence cleared after his strong first touch, and when Donkin came out of his area to clear a Lambs attack on 30, Taylor was unable to get to the loose ball to take advantage of his absence between the posts. Singh prevented Mills from finishing at the far post on 33 with a stop with his feet, but the Lambs keeper was unable to stop Mills doubling the lead when his shot from the left channel deflected off Cox and went in off the underside of the bar on 36 (0-2, 36 mins)

Thomas was booked for clipping the ankles of Quantrell as he advanced downfield, and despite continuing on his run play was brought back when Leiston lost possession. Tait crossed from the left and found the head of Concannon on 43 but he couldn't direct it on target and when Taylor prodded the ball across the six yard box it was just too long for the Lambs number 7 who was unable to drag it back off the byline.

As half time drew to a close Tamworth pushed on but seemed unable to get a foot hold on the game and Marsden nearly added a third goal but Singh pushed it away for a corner as the half time whistle blew. Tamworth made two changes at the break, with McDonald making his first appearance since picking up injury in on the opening day of the season, while Yeomans came in at right back in his first run out since injury, and Leiston restarted the game. Tamworth were more positive in the opening exchanges and Pendley's header from a Beswick freekick on 50 was on target, but smothered by Donkin. Wilder's cross from the left was then headed away from Waite by Odelusi and The Lambs continued to keep the visitors pressed back in their own half. McDonald was tumbled down by Odeluse 25 yards out on 57 and Beswick stepped up, left footed, but curled it just over the bar and into the away end. Waite received the ball in the box on the hour and side footed his covering defender but saw his shot from 12 yards blocked with just the keeper to beat. Saunders used his head of steam to advance from left back to force a left sided corner on 64 but Marsden's strike from 25 yards curled high over the target. Saunders was booked for a foul on Yeomans on 67, and from the ensuing play down the right McDonald picked up the ball in the box and struck home powerfully past Donkin at the second attempt (1-2, 67 mins)

Two freekicks in quick succession, both against Yeomans gave the visitors sight on goal but both times the Tamworth defence held strong.

Pendley's long ball into the area was headed behind for a left sided corner on 74 which Donkin punched clear and Leiston broke, but Yeomans was on hand to deny the run of Davies. Singh punched a Leiston corner clear on 79, but in the ensuing play Pendley was adjudged to have handled a thumping shot from outside the area and Davies duly converted the spot kick (1-3, 80 mins) Taylor, with the all at his feet, seemed to be brought down on 82, but no penalty was given, and Thomas struck a dropping shot on the volley on 83 but it was deflected out for a corner which came to nothing. Donkin was booked for timewasting on 83 and Walters replaced Thomas a minute later and despite a concerted effort from all concerned Leiston were not in a mood to concede again, and the final whistle blew on defeat, in a game which had been lost in the first half and chased in the second.

THE CHANGING FACE OF THE LAMB



Since the start of last season there have been some big changes at the Lamb which you can't help but spot. The 9 ageing and second hand floodlight columns have been replaced by 4 brand new state of the art LED floodlight towers. The lights are brighter and cheaper to run, and with the facility to dim them, they are suitable for use in a number of different situations.

Another major change is the investment in the clubhouse, identifiable by the refurbished roof and a redeveloped internal space following considerable damage caused by the winter weather. All in all just over £250,000 has been invested in the ground with a substantial amount provided by grants from the Football Stadia Improvement Fund and the generosity of supporters and backers of the club.



Since 2016 the Lamb has moved from a facility that was used two nights a week and a Saturday afternoon to a seven-days-a-week all year-round operation. The club has grown from one competitive team to 25 teams ranging from under-7s to the first team. There is also a full-time scholarship programme for 60 students aged 16-19. A women's section has been introduced with junior and adult teams. As a result, Tamworth FC is now the largest multi-team football club in the area with our academy in a partnership with Derby County.

The Football Stadia Improvement Fund (FSIF) is the largest funder of non-league football in the country. The FSIF is the sister organisation of the Football Foundation and is solely funded by the Premier League. It is the country's largest provider of grants towards projects that help improve the comfort and safety of lower-league football grounds in both the professional and amateur game. These improvements range from new football stands and turnstiles to flood-lighting and improved provision for disabled supporters.

HITCHIN TOWN



The first Hitchin FC was formed in 1865. The club took part in the first FA Cup in 1871-72, and reached the quarter finals of the competition, losing to eventual finalists Royal Engineers. That first Hitchin club, a struggling professional outfit, folded in 1911, debt-ridden and the victims of a fire at their ground.

It was not until 1928 that Hitchin Town FC was formed, and it was at this point that the nickname, "The Canaries", was established. Hitchin Town gained admission to the Spartan League. The 1930s were a golden age for Hitchin Town. The club won the AFA Senior Cup in 1932, beating Derbyshire Amateurs in the final and in 1935, they won the Spartan League Premier Division. The club entered the Athenian League in 1939, but after two league games and a Herts Charity Cup tie, WW2 intervened.

Hitchin struggled in the aftermath of World War Two in the Athenian League, not recovering until the mid-1950s. In 1956 a record crowd of 7,878 watched Hitchin Town beat Wycombe Wanderers 1-0 in the FA Amateur Cup. At the end of the 1962-63 season, the Canaries moved into the Isthmian League. This move was not an easy one for the club, and the early years were a constant struggle. But in 1968-69, Hitchin finished runners-up in the Isthmian League and a year later, won the London Senior Cup, beating St.Albans 4-2 in the final. Hitchin stayed in the Isthmian League until 2004, when as a result of a reorganisation they transferred to the Southern League. They won the Southern League Cup in 2006, and despite relegation in 2009, they won promotion back to the Premier Division in 2012, and in 2015-16 and 2016-17 they enjoyed their best-ever seasons in the Southern League, reaching the play-offs on both occasions but missing out on promotions through defeat in the semi-final and then the final. The team also won the Herts Senior Cup in both seasons. 2017-18 saw the start of the break-up of the play-offs team, with three of the key players from that team moving on to pastures new. Nevertheless that team achieved a safe and creditable league position of 11th, and they won the Southern League Cup and the Herts Charity Cup. Season 2018-19 was a season of rebuilding, and consolidation in the new Evo-Stik League South Premier Division Central was the objective. The team often struggled in the league, and despite some bad runs of results managed to finish 18th and so realised their objective. They fared very much better in the FA Cup, reaching the First Round Proper for the first time in 23 years before bowing out at home to Solihull Moors in front of a crowd of 3,148, the highest attendance at Top Field for over 40 years. The season ended on a high with some silverware, retaining the Hertfordshire Charity Cup by beating Hemel Hempstead Town 2-0.

Season 2019-20 was a time of real transition and consolidation. The Canaries found themselves in the relegation zone for much of the early part of the season. However a remarkable transformation in the middle of the season saw the team display form which if it had been continued, would have steered the team towards a play-off spot. When the season was cut short by the pandemic, the Canaries were comfortably placed in 17th position, safe from relegation. Season 2020-21 promised much for the Canaries. The team that finished the previous season stayed, and the continuity was starting to show dividends. When the season was curtailed, the Canaries were sitting in a very comfortable tenth place in the League, having bounced back from a nightmare 7-1 defeat at AFC Rushden and Diamonds to record impressive away wins at Stratford Town and Bromsgrove Sporting. This was followed by impressive wins in the FA Trophy against Herne Bay from the Isthmian League and Mickleover FC who at the time were league leaders in the Northern Premier League, before bowing out to eventual semi-finalists Peterborough Sports in the Second Round Proper.



The Canaries start the new season with most of last season's players staying, and the hope that the work from last season can be continued. They will also be celebrating the 150th Anniversary of the start of the FA Cup competition, in which the first Hitchin FC team participated. With many new ground improvements in place, the future is looking very bright for the Canaries.

HITCHIN TOWN PLAYERS

Charles Horlock

Goalkeeper who started his career at Wycombe Wanderers before spells at Stevenage U18s, Harrow Borough and Hendon. Horlock signed for the Canaries from Wycombe in November 2014, making 87 appearances between the sticks in what was initially a loan deal. After two seasons, Eastbourne Borough swooped for Horlock- he spent a year there before moving east along the coast to Hastings in late 2017. The goalkeeper returned to Top Field for the 2019/20 season, and is Mark Burke's first choice once again in the upcoming campaign. Widely viewed as one of the best shot stoppers at this level.

Josh Mollison

Back-up goalkeeper and academy coach who highly impressed in Hitchin's FA Youth Cup campaign of 2017/18, before loan spells at Biggleswade United Barton Rovers, Potters United and most recently Eynesbury Rovers, where he is currently on a dual registration.

Daniel Akubue

Full-back who signed from Berkhamsted in October 2020, immediately developing a very strong presence and providing competition at right-back

Alex Brown

Brother of Hitchin attacking midfielder Luke. 19 year-old left-back formerly of Soham Town Rangers and Godmanchester Rovers, who was signed at the start of 2021/22 pre-season and quickly impressed.

Malaki Black

Quick and energetic full back who can double up as a wing back if needed. Former MK Dons schoolboy who spent time on loan in Spain as part of the academy programme.

DANIEL WEBB

Hitchin captain, an experienced centre back going into a tenth at Top Field; who is nearing his 400th appearance for the club. Fan favourite Webb started out at Hitchin in 2012 after being spotted playing for Sheffield and Campton FC, and has gone on to score 31 goals from centre back.

CIAREN JONES

Bedford-born promising 20 year old centre-back who played for Luton U18s before a move to Norwich City's U23 side. Played for Gloucester City last season. Highly rated by the Hitchin coaches.

DARION FURLONG

Centre-back most recently plying his trade with Potters Bar Town. Joined the Canaries in pre-season and has impressed with his tackling and awareness.

SAMUEL OKAYE-AHANEKU

Right-back who signed from Wingate & Finchley in October 2019. Former Arsenal. Converted to centre back where he has impressed since. Trialled with Watford pre-season but has currently returned to the Canaries.

KYE TEARLE

Versatile 18 year old product of the Pro:Direct Academy in Baldock. Broke into the first team in the 2020/21 season, initially featuring as a right-back before moving into the number 10 role in 2021, a position he will compete for with Luke Brown this season.

RYAN SMITH

Young central midfielder who started off his career at Northampton as an 18 year old first year scholar in July 2018. Mark Burke signed him initially on a work experience loan deal from the Cobblers in February 2020, and he will challenge for his place in the centre of midfield this season.

JOSH COLDICOTT-STEVENSON

Yet another central midfielder who is enjoying stiff competition for a starting role in Mark Burke's side this season. Josh began his career across Hertfordshire for Boreham Wood in 2016, and went out on loan to both St. Neots and Kings Langley in the 2016/17 season. Kings Langley clearly liked what they saw, and signed Coldicott-Stevens on a permanent deal. He spent two seasons there before signing for the Canaries midway through the 2019/20 season.

LAWRIE MARSH

Right sided defensive midfielder or centre back who arrived from Biggleswade FC after four seasons there, making a total of 105 appearances across all competitions, scoring 17 goals. Lawrie joins up with his twin brother Alex at Top Field.

LEWIS BARKER

Strong, no-nonsense defensive midfielder who never loses an aerial battle. Barker started out for Baldock in the 2013/14 season, before staying at the club for another five seasons, making a total of 222 appearances for

Baldock. Lewis signed for Hitchin at the start of the 2019/20 season and is a regular in the centre of midfield.

LUKE BROWN

Attacking midfielder is the son of former Canary Stuart Brown, who played at Top Field in the early 1990's. Luke started out at Cambridge City as a youngster, before going to play University soccer in the USA, where he represented the University of Maryland and USL League Two team Lionsbridge FC. Returned to England, where he played for Ely City before joining the Canaries for the curtailed 2020/21 campaign. Signed for St. Albans City, where he featured in this pre-season before re-joining Hitchin where travelling demands proved to be somewhat easier. A massive asset to Mark Burke's squad.

CALLUM STEAD

Speedy forward who signed for Hitchin from Welwyn Garden City after scoring 11 goals in 2019/20, including a goal in Welwyn's 5-0 win against the Canaries in the Southern League Cup. Stead became an instant fan favourite after scoring both goals in a pre-season win against Barnet last year, and continued his fine form in the short 20/21 season. Only played roughly half of pre-season but scored eight goals.

HENRY SNEE

Right footed striker who trialled with the Canaries for the 2020/21 pre-season after spending the 19/20 season at Shefford Town and Campton, scoring an incredible 38 goals in 40 appearances. Injury problems plagued his progress at Top Field last season, but Snee returned for pre-season 2021/22 and was regularly on the scoresheet. His persistence has been rewarded with him signing

for the Canaries for the forthcoming season and he will be looking to challenge for the number 9 shirt.

RIO DA SILVA

21 year old winger or attacking midfielder whose career began in the Luton Town academy setup before spending four years as a Chelsea academy prospect. After leaving the Blues, Da Silva spent a year at Dunstable Town before joining Hitchin at the start of the 2020/21 season.

URIJAH GORDON-DOUGLAS

Former Northampton Town Academy striker who has recently signed for the Canaries. Has also played for Daventry Town.

For those with long memories, we last played Lye Town in 1995 when Paul Hendrie was boss, in the other County Cup competition we entered at the time, the Staffordshire Cup, and ran out 9-3 winners at The Lamb.

And we last visited the Sports Ground, Stourbridge Road, Lye, DY9 7DH on 03 September 1991 in an FA Cup replay under Ron Bradbury and defeated them 3-1 with goals from Steve Cartwright, Darron Morris and Mark Smith.

NON LEAGUE ROUND UP WITH MARK MAYBURY

Pitching In Southern League Premier Central Round Up from the Weekend.

Peterborough Sports moved three points clear at the top of the table on Saturday.

The Turbines had a comprehensive 4-0 win at the Victoria Ground against Bromsgrove Sporting after a disappointing week. Jimmy Dean's side took an early 5th-minute lead with a header from defender Richard Jones. The visiting skipper doubled Sports' lead after 14 minutes when he fired home from close range. With 12 minutes remaining the visitors grabbed their third with a fine strike from sub Josh McCammon, then 2 minutes later, Dan Jarvis went through on goal to make it 4-0.

Coalville were held to a 2-2 draw at Garden Walk by Royston Town. The Ravens took the lead after 20 minutes with an excellent individual effort from Tom McGlinchey. The Crows were back on level terms 13 minutes later when Isaac Galliford fired home from the edge of the area. Just on the stroke of half-time, the home side took the lead again in rather fortunate fashion as Josh Williams' cross eluded Coalville 'keeper Tomasz Bukowski and went straight in. Coalville eventually pulled back on level terms on 65 minutes when McGlinchey bagged his second with a shot that went in off a post.

Rushall Olympic are eight points adrift of Peterborough Sports in fourth after winning 2-1 at Needham Market. The Pics took a 17th-minute lead through Tyler Little's free-kick, but Byron Lawrence hit a fine leveller for the Marketmen in first half injury time. Little bagged his second in the 74th minute to make it 2-1 with a cracking long-range effort.

Hednesford Town, who have been busy in the transfer market this week, are fifth after recording a 4-2 win at Westwood Road against third-from-bottom St Ives Town. Liam Cross gave the Saints the lead and then after Chay Tilt had equalised 3 minutes later, Edmund Hotter restored the hosts' advantage in first-half injury-time. It looked as though St Ives were going to follow up their crucial win against fellow strugglers Hitchin Town in midweek with another three points, but the Pitmen hit them hard in the final 10 minutes. Firstly Tilt equalised on 81 minutes and then almost straight from the restart, Shaquille Master put the visitors ahead for the first time and then in stoppage time, new boy Riley O'Sullivan, grabbed a fourth.

Tonight's visitors Hitchin Town made it nine games without a win in all competitions with a 1-0 home defeat at Top Field to Stratford Town. The Bards took a 39th-minute lead with a header from former Lamb Jaanai Gordon. Despite the visitors being reduced to ten men, they hung on to claim all 3 points.

Barwell went down to a 2-1 defeat at Lye Meadow to Alvechurch, who are now eighth.

The visitors had the lead though through Tristan Dunkley after 14 minutes. Tyrell Hamilton, on loan from AFC Telford United, equalised 12 minutes later. But it wasn't until 7 minutes from time that Jamie Willetts popped up with the home side's winner.

Leiston moved above Tamworth into sixth place after winning 3-1 at the CR MOT Centre Community Stadium.


