We welcome you all to the CR MOT Centre Community Stadium this evening for this important Pitching In Southern League Premier Central local derby against Hednesford Town. In particular we extend our welcome to the supporters, players and officials of our visitors today and trust you enjoy the hospitality offered, and that you have a safe journey home following the game. This is the rearranged game that was called off on New Year's Day following Covid running rampant through the Tamworth camp.

Andy Peaks enjoyed his 3rd unbeaten game on Saturday since taking charge of the Lambs, However, the win on Saturday was a lot harder to come by than the previous weekend when 6 goals put Barwell to the sword. Bromsgrove Sporting were a physical outfit and put up a good fight in a game that could have gone either way. Dan Creaney popped up with the all important second half strike that moved Tamworth further away from the bottom end of the table.

The Pitmen arrive at the Lamb tonight for the 95th game between the local rivals in all competitions. Both teams are playing two steps below their potential, having competed at the top level of Non League football in their histories, and will want to be back at that level in the near future. The first game between the two sides came in January 1946 when Tamworth enjoyed a 3 - 1 victory in a Birmingham Combination fixture. The largest crowd for a Lambs/Pitmen clash was for a Staffs Senior Cup game in Feb 1997 when 2541 supporters witnessed a 2 - 0 win for Hednesford at the Keys Park ground. The last time the two teams faced each other was back in the 2019/20 season when Hednesford won 1 - 0 at the Lamb (att 891), but Tamworth won the game on New Year's Day 3 - 0 with goals from Bilal Yafai and Chris Lait (att 809).

Hednesford sit just one point ahead of Tamworth in the league table, having played one game less. A disappointing home defeat to Stratford Town on Saturday saw the Pitmen go 5 games without a win in all competitions and will want to put that right this evening.

We are without a game this coming Saturday, but then face two difficult away games. First up is a long trip to Leiston on Tuesday 15 March for the rearranged fixture. Then on Saturday 19 March it will be an emotional return to AFC Rushden and Diamonds for Andy Peaks as we face his former club.

Enjoy the game this evening!

PEAKS SPEAKS

Lambs Media caught up with manager Andy Peaks after the win over Bromsgrove Sporting on Saturday. “It wasn’t a great game to watch, but the important thing for me was to get 3 points. “It wasn’t the best we have played but I thought the boys showed the qualities we expect from them.



Andy had the luxury of selecting the same starting line up for a third game in a row, something that hasn’t happened since Jan 2020, ironically against Bromsgrove Sporting, But, is there anyone pushing to take a shirt of one of the current players? “Yes they all are - the players on the bench and the whole squad. “All the boys have done well in the games and training and I am not about change for the sake of changing, however, we will see changes, maybe on Tuesday - who knows??. “There are players knocking on my door and that is the way I like it.”

On reflecting about the game itself, Andy knew it was going to be a difficult game, “We knew that Bromsgrove were going to be big, strong and physical and we were nowhere near our best. “You have to win the battle first to earn the right and we didn’t really do that. “But what we did was stick at it and in the last 15 mins, some of the blocks we got in, that for me is as good as a great strike because that shows the desire we need to be successful. “That win today was as good as the 6 we got last Saturday.”

Andy knows what he wants to see from his Tamworth side as he settles into the role. “I want to see us pass the ball but you have to remember that these players haven’t got a lot of confidence, they have had a tough time and don’t want to make mistakes. “Perhaps at times today we went too long, but we will build that confidence and belief and good football will come. “We were a little too deep in the first half, which means the gaps were too big and when the balls went to Dan there was no one near him, “But at the end of the day we have a clean sheet and 3 points and it can only be good for us in the long run. “That meant a lot to a lot of people today - the players’ reaction and the supporters’ reaction.”

Andy doesn’t mind that the Hednesford game comes straight on top of the Bromsgrove game rather than having the advantage of another training session. “When you are winning you want to keep playing. “You learn more about your team in matches than training. “We are on a good run, but the Monday game at Hitchin was a bit of a killer coming so close to the weekend game. “Tuesday is a little different as you have that extra day to recover and prepare. “And we haven’t got a game on Saturday, so that gives us opportunities to train and rest too.”

PEAKS and TROUGHS

Ahead of our trip to Hayden Road a week on Saturday, the fantastic resource that is the Rushden and Diamonds history website rdfc1992.com helped to provide the information in this lookback, which gives us a chance to reminisce about some Lambs matches and in particular ones where Andy Peaks played against us!

Andy was 21 on his debut for Rushden and Diamonds and he went on to make 205 appearances, scoring 1 goal. His debut was on 5 September 1992 at home to Bridgnorth Town and his final game was on 7 October 1997 away to Hayes.

During his time he played against us on three occasions, all in the Beazer Homes Midland Division and all in 1993!

The games were on 27 March (A) - 0-0, 24 August (H) - 1-1 and 20 November (A) - 1-5, the latter against an impressive Diamonds side being one we would probably prefer to forget but we'll go into more detail next time. (Newspaper clippings courtesy The Tamworth Herald /

THE CHANGING FACE OF THE LAMB



Since the start of last season there have been some big changes at the Lamb which you can't help but spot. The 9 ageing and second hand floodlight columns have been replaced by 4 brand new state of the art LED floodlight towers. The lights are brighter and cheaper to run, and with the facility to dim them, they are suitable for use in a number of different situations.

Another major change is the investment in the clubhouse, identifiable by the refurbished roof and a redeveloped internal space following considerable damage caused by the winter weather. All in all just over £250,000 has been invested in the ground with a substantial amount provided by grants from the Football Stadia Improvement Fund and the generosity of supporters and backers of the club.

Since 2016 the Lamb has moved from a facility that was used two nights a week and a Saturday afternoon to a seven-days-a-week all year-round operation. The club has grown from one competitive team to 25 teams ranging from under-7s to the first team. There is also a full-time scholarship programme for 60 students aged 16-19. A women's section has been introduced with junior and adult teams. As a result, Tamworth FC is now the largest multi-team football club in the area with our academy in a partnership with Derby County.

The Football Stadia Improvement Fund (FSIF) is the largest funder of non-league football in the country. The FSIF is the sister organisation of the Football Foundation and is solely funded by the Premier League. It is the country's largest provider of grants towards projects that help improve the comfort and safety of lower-league football grounds in both the professional and amateur game. These improvements range from new football stands and turnstiles to floodlighting and improved provision for disabled supporters.

TODAY'S VISITORS



The Pitmen were formed in 1880 with the amalgamation of two teams, the Red and Whites (who were also known as West Hill) and Hill Top. The newly formed club played their games at 'The Tins', which was at the rear of The Anglesey Hotel in Hednesford and remained there until 1904, when they moved to 'The Cross Keys'.

'The Cross Keys' was home to the Pitmen until the 1994/95 season when the club moved to the new purpose-built 'Keys Park' stadium, which has a 6039 capacity and currently holds a Football Association Grade B ground grading certificate.

Hednesford Town FC may have a long and proud history but it was not until January 1990 that the club's fortunes turned for the better. The 1989/90 season had been a struggle and, at the beginning of the year, the club were in a deep relegation battle and, with gates below 300, relegation from The Beazer Homes Midland Division looked a distinct possibility. In an effort to avoid relegation the club appointed former goalkeeper, John Baldwin, as manager and he gradually began to turn the club around and relegation was avoided.

The following season the team finished third and then gained promotion to the Beazer Homes League Premier Division, after finishing the 91/92 season as runners-up to Solihull Borough. In the same season the club became the first English football team to play at The Welsh National Stadium losing 1-0 to Cardiff City, in the final of the Welsh Cup.

In the first season in the Premier Division the Pitmen finished in a creditable fourth position and reached the Staffordshire Senior Cup Final losing to Stoke City over two legs. The 93/94 season saw the club reach a cup final for the third year running, this time it was The Birmingham Senior Cup Final where at The Bescot Stadium they were beaten 3-0 by a full strength Walsall team.

The following season the club were crowned Beazer Homes League Premier Division champions with the team defeating Leek Town in front of 2776 supporters at The Cross Keys to clinch the title and promotion to the GM Vauxhall Conference.

The Pitmen commenced their first season in The Conference at their new Keys Park home and in the club's first season in the top flight of non-league football they finished in third place behind champions Stevenage Borough and Woking.

The 1996/97 season will go down as the best in the club's history as the Pitmen reached the first round of the FA Cup for the first time in 72 years, eventually losing in the fourth round at Middlesbrough, in front of 27,500 supporters.

The following season saw the club finish in seventh position and further FA Cup success was enjoyed as, in front of millions of Match of the Day viewers, the Pitmen beat Hull City 2-0 at Boothferry Park but in the second round lost to Darlington.



In the 98/99 season the club reached the first round of the FA Cup for the third season running. This time the team beat Barnet 3-1 in the first round but lost by the same scoreline away at Cardiff City in the next round.

League success did not follow the fine cup runs and the 1999/2000 season saw the team drop to 17th position then, after John Baldwin had stepped down during December 2000, the club were relegated for the first time in their history.

A succession of managers were appointed to replace John Baldwin including Neil Pointon, Colin Lambert, Paul Raynor, Kenny Hibbitt and Ian Painter.

The club's first season back in the Southern League was a big disappointment and only a last day victory away at Newport (IOW) saved a second consecutive relegation.

The team started the 2002/03 season with Ian Painter in charge but, with the Pitmen hovering around the relegation zone, Ian was replaced during February 2003 by Barry Powell, who returned to the club after a spell at Stafford Rangers. Barry had previously been assistant manager to Kenny Hibbitt.

Despite the club's FA Trophy success in May 2004, when Canvey Island were defeated 3-2 at Villa Park, Barry Powell was replaced as manager by Chris Brindley. The club had failed during the 2003/04 season to finish high enough in the league to move into the new Conference set up but promotion came twelve months later, when a place in The Football Conference Northern Division was gained after winning play off games away at Merthyr Tydfil and Chippenham Town.

The 05/06 season saw the Pitmen again reach the first round of the FA Cup but the team were defeated 4-0 away at Histon. The team continued to leak goals and, as a result of a number of poor results, Chris Brindley left the club by mutual consent in early December 2005. Chris' assistant manager, former Wimbledon star, Steve Anthrobus, was appointed Manager but he was unable to save the club from relegation to The Unibond Northern Premier League.

Former Nottingham Forest player, Phil Starbuck, was appointed manager in July 2006 and, despite challenging near the top of the table for the majority of the 06/07 season, a slump in form after Christmas saw the team eventually finish in 7th position. In the 07/08 season, the Pitmen ended a disappointing season in 8th position and Phil Starbuck was replaced during the summer by Dean Edwards who appointed former Scottish international, Matt Elliott, as his Assistant Manager.

The 08/09 season saw the Pitmen in commanding form for the first half of the season once again, but a loss of form in the New Year saw the title challenge fade away, with the team finishing in a disappointing 8th place. One consolation was that the side went on to win the Birmingham Senior Challenge Cup for only a second time after a wait of 73 years, beating Stourbridge 2-0 in the final.



After a disappointing start to the 2009/10 campaign Dean Edwards left the club and Simon Line, formerly of Market Drayton Town FC, was appointed to the vacant team manager position. Simon brought former Kidderminster Harriers player, Delwyn Humphreys, to Keys Park as his number two.

More managerial chaos followed in early January 2010 when Simon Line handed in his resignation for 'personal reasons' and this resulted in the appointment of former Pitman and Northern Ireland star, Bernard McNally into the Keys Park management hot seat. Delwyn Humphreys agreed to stay on as Bernie's Assistant Manager, after a short spell as caretaker manager, following Line's departure. Under this management team the Pitmen finished the season strongly and ended in a creditable fourth place, earning a play off semi-final tie away at Chippenham Town FC, which the Pitmen lost 2-0.

After a shock early exit from the 2010/11 FA Cup Bernard McNally and his then assistant Stuart Brock left the club to be replaced by the former AFC Telford United management team, Rob Smith and Larry Chambers in late September 2010.

After a very successful season finishing 2nd in the Southern League Premier Division, winning the Southern League Cup and losing on penalties to Salisbury City FC in the Play-off Final the Pitmen were moved laterally into the Evo-Stik Northern Premier League.

After a satisfactory first season back in the Evo-Stik NPL, finishing in 5th place and earning a Play Off place, losing to promoted Bradford Park Avenue, Smith set about rebuilding the team for the new season, making wholesale changes.

The 2012-13 campaign was one of the best in the history of the club, with the club finishing second in the league with 93 points and then gaining promotion through the Play Offs, beating AFC Fylde and then FC United of Manchester, the Final setting a new attendance record at Keys Park of 4412. The promotion to the Conference was complemented by winning both the Birmingham and Staffordshire Senior Cups in a truly historic season.

The success story continued in 2013-14 with Smith and Chambers once more guiding the team to the play-offs, losing narrowly over two legs to Altrincham FC who were eventually promoted. The team also acquitted themselves well in the FA Cup getting to the First Round proper, losing 2-1 to Crawley Town FC and also got to the Final of the Birmingham Senior Cup, losing to Conference Premier side Tamworth FC.

The 2014-15 season was a season of consolidation for the Pitmen who were in play-off contention at Christmas but faded in the run-in, finishing in a creditable 8th place in the Conference North. Soon after the commencement of the 2015-16 season the club were rocked by the news that Smith and Chambers were leaving to take up the vacant management positions at rivals AFC Telford United. After a flurry of interest in the posts at Keys Park, former manager Bernard McNally was appointed to the manager position to be assisted by club stalwart Chris Brindley, however, after a poor run of results in which the team only picked up 8 pts in 11 league matches McNally was relieved of his duties. In mid December 2015, former Chelsea and Leicester City star Frank Sinclair was appointed to the manager's position, bringing in Chris Millington as his Assistant, a colleague of his at Oldham Athletic FC Academy. Despite their best efforts Frank and Chris were unable to avoid relegation and left the club in April 2016. After much interest in the vacant manager role, the club appointed Liam McDonald fresh from a very successful season with Redditch United FC. After losing Liam McDonald to Solihull Moors FC in November 2016 there followed another period of management instability with Paul Casey having three months in charge followed by his assistant manager Gary Birch. When Gary Birch resigned at the end of the season the club moved quickly to appoint manager Neil Tooth who had been the preferred external candidate when the previous internal appointment had been made, however, in September Neil Tooth left the club and this heralded the return of Rob Smith and Larry Chambers to Keys Park. The new management team heralded a strong mid-season resurgence by the Pitmen but this did not last and the performances dropped off towards the end of the season, finishing in a disappointing 16th position in the League.



The 2018-19 season started with mixed results but took a turn for the worse in late November when Smith and Chambers left the club to take up a position elsewhere, the club decided in late December to appoint Nicky Eaden as Manager who was joined by Gary Hayward as Assistant Manager. After a strong finish to the season Gary Hayward was appointed as team manager and recruited Mark Ward from AFC Mansfield as his Assistant and fans favourite Danny Glover as player/coach. In early December 2019, Gary Hayward and Mark Ward left to take up a management offer at Buxton FC, Danny Glover and Ben Bailey took immediate charge of team affairs and was joined by experienced former Port Vale FC manager, Dean Glover to assist in the dugout. This was the season that coronavirus struck with the season shut down in mid March and all results expunged. Amidst all of the chaos though, 2020 saw Hednesford Town FC move into a new era of ownership as Graham Jones took over the club as Chairman along with his partner Hayden Dando on 1st May. Shortly afterwards, Andy Morrell was appointed as team manager with Danny Glover as his Assistant Manager and former Stafford Rangers manager, Alex Meechan, joining the coaching staff. With only a few weeks of the new season past and with the Pitmen on the bottom of the league and out of the FA Cup, Andy Morrell and Alex Meechan left the club and were replaced by Keenen Meakin-Richards and Graham Deakin as the interim management team. In another disrupted season due to the pandemic, Keenen Meakin-Richards and Graham Deakin were confirmed as the management team, they were joined by Jemiah Richards as coach and Richard Mills as goalkeeper coach.

The Pitmen got the game back underway and Woolery forced an early corner which was headed away to Evans and his ball back into the box was met with a sweet far post finish by Reindorf to put The Lambs into the lead (2-1, 47 mins).

However, on 51 Batis-Cande brought down Riley and Disney fired the spot kick home (2-2, 51 mins) but the lead was quickly regained when Woolery latched onto what appeared to be a back pass to Crane and he slotted home from the left of the box into the far right corner.

Thornton made it four with a deft finish from the edge of the area over Crane's advances (4-2, 65 mins). Belford denied sub Robinson's far post header in added time at the end of the game and after Johnson had fired wide of the mark Woolery broke through and squared for Batis-Cande to finish at the second attempt to make it 5-2 and book a place in the final at The Hawthorns on Tuesday 29th April.

Taylor was booked for a wayward challenge on Mussa as he tried to advance over the half way line on 29 and from the freekick Hurst nearly turned the loose ball home but fired into the side netting from the right of the box.

Just past the hour-mark, the home side went ahead when top scorer Jake Reed went round Snedker to slip into an empty net. However, on 71 minutes, Diamonds levelled matters when Ryan Hughes got on the end of a deep free-kick. It looked as though the strugglers would hold out for a point – until a minute into stoppage time with a dramatic free-kick from Tshikuna, who caught out the home keeper from 40 yards and the ball went in off an upright.

The day's other game saw Stratford Town win 2-1 at Keys Park against tonight's visitors Hednesford Town. The Bards led 2-0 at half-time, thanks to goals from Dan Lafferty after 14 minutes and veteran Leroy Lita on the half-hour-mark. Hednesford's response came too late in the 89th minute from Lewis Ludford-Ison.

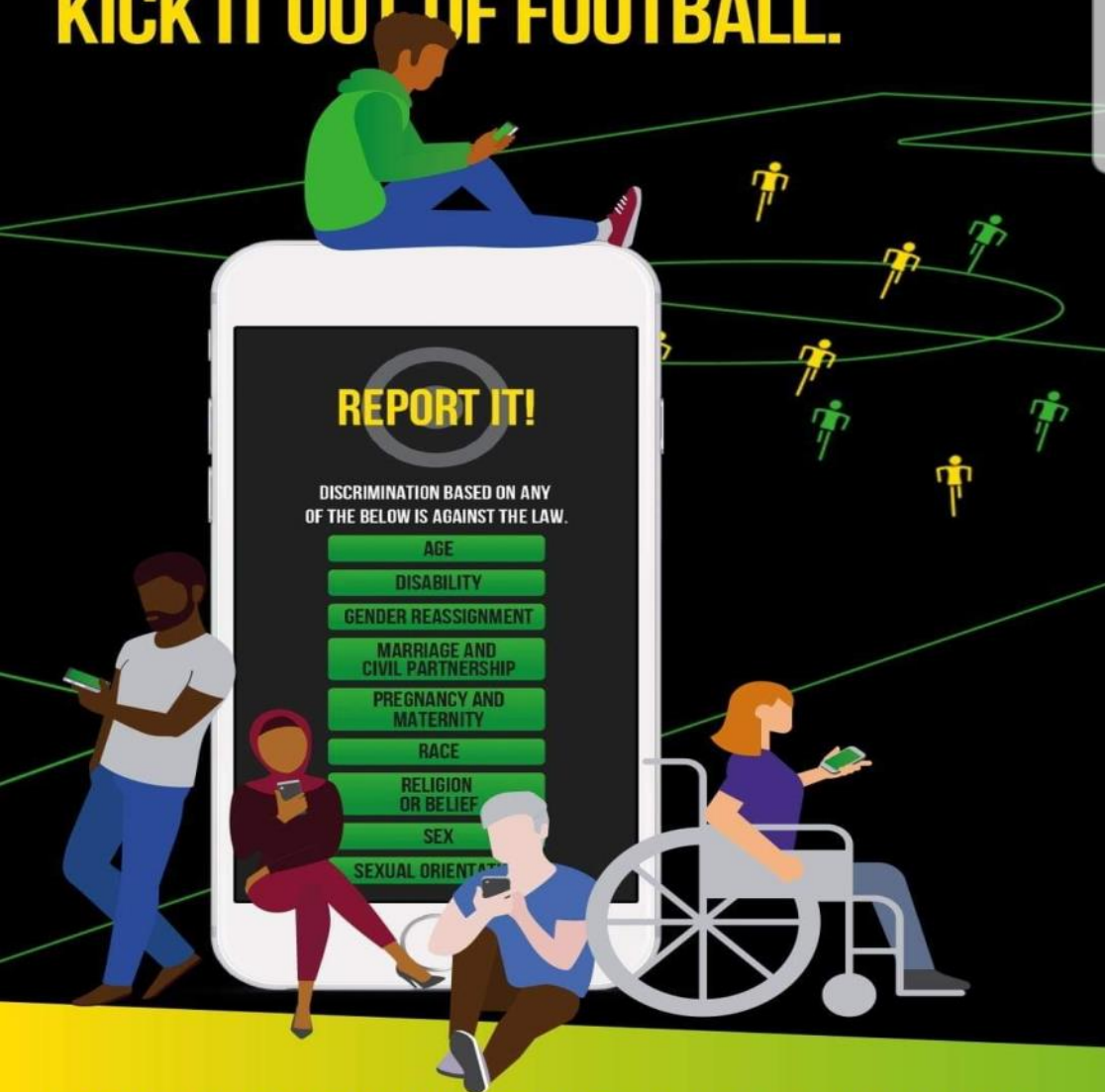
