TO RACISM

2021-22 SEASON - MATCHDAY 50

We extend a warm welcome to everybody here tonight for this penultimate game in the 2021/22 season. It is unusual to play on a Thursday evening and will be the third game in a very busy week for both teams.

Tonight's game has been arranged due to the first game, on 11 December, being abandoned following allegations of a racist comment being made against a Biggleswade Town player.

Extensive investigations were made into the alleged incident including the taking of witness statements, viewing and listening to audio and video recordings and reporting the matter to the Staffordshire Police Football Unit.

The matter was reported to the Southern League and investigated by the Football Association. Following their investigation the Football Association concluded that 'no formal disciplinary action would be taken by the FA' and that 'no action will be taken against either club'.

People often talk about meaningless end of season games, but that can't be said of tonight's encounter. For Biggleswade Town it is a must win game for them to stand any chance of escaping relegation. They sit 6 points behind Hitchin Town and Nuneaton Borough with just one game left on Saturday. A defeat or draw for the Waders tonight will see them consigned to the relegation places, however, a win will set up a number of tense games on Saturday for them, and the two other clubs on 39 points.

We, on the other hand have seen a complete change in form since Andy Peaks and his management team took over in February. With relegation staring the Lambs in the face, sitting 4th from bottom of the table, we have since gone on a 12 game unbeaten run and the manager is in no mood to see that record broken. Andy has stated that his first target was to get enough points to escape relegation and with the target achieved, he is now making plans for an assault on promotion next season.

The busy week ends on Saturday with another home game, this time against St Ives Town. A couple of wins for Tamworth will see them secure 9th place in the final table, something that seemed impossible back in February.

Enjoy tonight's game and see you in less than 48 hours!

TODAY'S VISITORS



1874-1954 - the First 80 Years

Biggleswade Town were originally formed as Biggleswade F.C. in 1874 and began by playing friendlies. They became one of the founder members of the Biggleswade and District League in 1902/03 and won the championship at the first attempt. The successful season was climaxed by winning the Bedfordshire Senior Cup - the first of eight victories so far in the competition. The 'Waders', as the club are known, first entered the FA Cup in 1904.

1955-2005 In 1955, they joined the Eastern Counties League until 1963. The club's only successes in this period came in the Beds Senior Cup and the North Beds Charity Cup. The 'Waders' reverted to the UCL in 1964, where they remained until 1980. They left the League and joined the South Midlands League in the following season. After a few seasons in Division 1, promotion to the Premier Division was finally achieved in 1986/87.

2006-2008 The Board appointed Chris Nunn as manager in November 2006 after a very poor start to the season saw the team well adrift and heading for certain relegation. In February 2007, the team had made up a lot of points but were still bottom of the Premier table. The teaam avoided relegation on the last league day of the season and a new era seemed to sweep in an expectation of better times ahead. The winning of the NBC Cup in the very last match of the campaign reinforced that optimism.

The 2007 - 08 season saw the squad develop further with new signings and for the first time in 15 years the club found itself top of the division at one point.

According to the entry on Wikipedia for Biggleswade Town the club originally played at the Fairfield Road ground, which was shared with a local cricket club. A wooden stand was erected in the 1920s, and for several years had an Anderson shelter on either side. Floodlights were installed in 1989, and the wooden stand was demolished after being condemned in the 1990s.

However, in 2006 the club left Fairfield Road and groundshared with Bedford United & Valerio whilst a new ground was built on Langford Road with a capacity of 3,000 and 300 seats.

The History of The Waders..

The new ground progressed and was named The Carlsberg Stadium after a sponsor search. A final position of 3rd was a result of hard work and changes gradually moving the club forward. As the 2008/09 season beckoned, The Carlsberg Stadium was ready for occupation and the seasons in the 'wilderness of ground sharing' were over. For the first time in the clubs 134 year history, it finally had a home of its very own.

The new ground was opened for the start of the 2008-09 season, with the first game on 13 August 2008 between Biggleswade Town and Hertford Town resulting in a 1-0 for the home team.

2008-2009 Moving into the new ground certainly created a great feeling at the Club and new faces began to appear on the playing side as well as behind the scenes.

As the final whistle blew on the last friendly there was a definite feeling of readiness for the forthcoming season. The Wader's first season (2009-10) at Step Four proved a tough start but gradually the team strengthened and finished in a comfortable twelfth place with the team taking points off every side that season except Bury Town and Hitchin Town who finished first and second respectively.

2010-2011 This season saw the Waders climb to their highest ever position in the football pyramid, finally finishing in 4th place and with the resultant position in the playoffs. Waders travelled to 3rd place Daventry Town, a team they had previously beaten both home and away in the regular season. Football being football, Daventry ran out easy winners ending Waders hopes of promotion.

2011-2012 This season saw the Waders fade as season progressed. Having topped the league early in the season, injuries and suspensions took its toll and the season finished with a top half finish just outside the play offs.

2012-2013 Winning the 2012/13 Playoff final secured a place in the Southern League Premier, was upstaged by the best ever season in the club's 140 year history, finishing 9th in our first Premier season, reaching the First Round Proper of the FA Cup losing to a well organised Stourbridge side. Season ended with Waders beating Luton Town at Luton to lift the County Cup.

2013-2014 First season ever at step three and the Waders feel they have arrived. Finishing a creditable 9th in the table and reaching the FA Cup first round proper for the first time in the clubs history put the club in the record books. The Waders were the draw specialist of the premier division and had they converted the drawn games to winning ones, they would have finished in the play off positions. Winning the Beds Senior Cup for the second successive season was the icing on the cake.

2014-2015 This season was a real test for the Waders, with injuries both on and off the field. Long term injuries meant bringing in loan players and they all played their part.

2015-2016 A difficult season for the Waders, Southern League gets harder every season, an injection of new players helped steer the ship.

2016-2017 Having established their premier status the Waders went on to achieve their highest points total and finished just outside the play-offs in a creditable 7th position

2017-2018 Tough season with the club suffering a number of significant injuries ended with a Mid Table finish and a narrow loss to Luton Town in the Beds Senior Cup Final.

2018-2019 A successful first season for new manager Lee Allinson and his new squad. Winners of the Beds senior cup. 7th in the Southern League Central Premier division, narrowly missing a play-off place. Reached the 2nd round qualifying of the FA trophy only just beaten 1-0 away to conference side AFC Fylde

2020-2021 Following a disruptive 2019-20 season involving the loss of Lee Allinson and most of the squad to Hendon, Waders appointed former manager Chris Nunn in caretaker role to see the season out. The COVID-19 pandemic brought the season to an early close with the club safe from any relegation worries despite having to put together a new team in mid-season. Nunny was re-appointed full time manager for the 2020-2021 season, bringing in Scott Davies and Russell Short as Assistants, COVID-19 ended the season again with the team looking towards mid-table

2021-2022 Chris Nunn started the season with Russell Short and Joe Howe as assistants, Howe having joined from Hendon in the summer as player-coach and Scott Davies having moved on. A new squad has been assembled and started the season reasonably well despite a number of COVID enforced absences. Nunn stepped down in January 2022 after a poor run of results and was replaced by Robbie O'Keefe.

IN OPPOSITION

ROBBIE O'KEEFE - MANAGER

Robbie has a wealth of non-league management experience, including at Hitchin Town, Arlesey Town and St Neots Town. Robbie jointly managed Arlesey Town to FA Vase glory at Wembley in the mid1990s. He joined the Waders in January 2022 following the departure of Chris Nunn. Robbie also continues to head Stevenage FC's Category 3 Academy and retains a wealth of contacts in the game that Waders hope to benefit from.

JOE HOWE (CAPTAIN) - DEFENCE

Recently joined the club in a player-assistant manager role from Hendon FC. Joe had made 23 appearances for Hendon during the past two COVID hit seasons. Joe has slotted in at left-back to provide cover whilst also running the team management with the previous manager Chris Nunn. Joe has now stepped up to be club captain and provide much needed experience in the team.

JOSH HILL - GOALKEEPER

New Zealand-born backup goalkeeper who lists Chesham Utd, Swindon Supermarine, Hawkes Bay, Stop Out, Wairarapa Utd and Napier Cyprus amongst his former clubs. Recently has become a regular in goal for the Waders with confidence growing and an outstanding performance against Bromsgrove Sporting.

KANE FARRELL - DEFENCE

Farrell, 25, is an attack-minded left-back who originally signed for Biggleswade Town in the summer of 2020. He was previously with Kings Langley and Wingate & Finchley. An ever-present for the Waders this season, despite the mid-season squad changes.

CHARLEY O'KEEFE - DEFENCE

An excellent 1 v 1 left-footed defender who started the season at Welling United in the Conference South before a nasty ankle injury and COVID ended his stay. Returned to fitness at neighbours Biggleswade FC during November – January before signing recently for the Club

CAIN KELLER - DEFENCE

Recent signing from Hendon, Cain is equally at home in midfield or at right-back. A very athletic, technical player who can also put his foot in.

JALEN JONES - DEFENCE

Tall and rangy central defender who joined the Waders in March on a dual registration with Braintree Town in the National League South. Settled into the Waders backline with a debut goal against Needham Market and offers much-needed height both defending and attacking set-pieces.

SAM SQUIRE - MIDFIELD

Squire, 21, is an attacking midfielder who first put pen to paper for the Waders last summer. He'd joined league rivals, Needham Market, on a permanent basis in June 2019 after being released by Cambridge United. He spent 2018/19 on loan with the Marketmen from the League Two outfit...

BLAKE D'ARCY - MIDFIELD

Central midfielder Blake D'Arcy joined Biggleswade from Isthmian League South Central Division side Chalfont St Peter earlier this month. Blake signed for the Saints last summer having previously been on the books at League One newcomers Cambridge United.

JOE DEARMAN - MIDFIELD

Another recent signing, from near neighbours St Neots Town. Joe provides further competition for midfield places and his preferred position is on the left side. A former Spurs Youth and Cambridge United under 18s player, Joe brings experience despite only being 20 years old.

ADIAN MANNING - MIDFIELD

Signed on loan from Watford's under 18s, Adian has featured for Watford's under 23s on occasions this season. Recently scored the winning goal in Watford's recent FA Youth Cup win over Cardiff City. Adian marked his debut for Waders with the opening goal in the 1-1 draw with Nuneaton Borough.

DEAN PARRETT - MIDFIELD

Ex-professional Dean brings a wealth of experience to the Waders' midfield. Dean's youth career started at QPR before moving on to Spurs where he spent several years, making the first team in a UEFA Cup tie versus Shakhtar Donetsk. Several loans followed to clubs including Charlton Athletic, Plymouth Argyle and Swindon Town before Dean moved on to have two spells at Stevenage. More recently Dean has played for Wealdstone and Barnet and joins Waders with a career total of 253 games and 32 goals to date. Scored a penalty in his second game for Waders in the win v Needham Market.

ROBBIE PARKER - MIDFIELD

A competitive midfielder who re-joined the Waders from St Ives Town earlier this season. Opportunities initially limited by injury/illness and suspension but now having a consistent run in the team. Versatile enough to play at centre half when needed

ENOCH ANDOH - MIDFIELD/FORWARD

Signed for the Waders from Stratford Town in January 2021. 28 years old forward with non-league experience at a number of clubs. Higher-level experience includes time at Port Vale from League Two. Originally played upfront for Waders but has recently been playing a creative attacking role in midfield. for the Waders so far are limited by injuries.

MAX GRANVILLE - MIDFIELD

Central midfielder who is comfortable on the ball and doing the defensive work in front of the defensive line. Joined the Waders on a work experience opportunity from Stevenage. Impressed in the away draw at Stratford Town but unfortunately picked up an injury afterwards which has limited his playing time.

LUKE MIDDLETON - MIDFIELD

Recently signed from local rivals, Biggleswade FC, Luke joins the club when competition is needed in midfield. An aggressive versatile player who is very comfortable in possession

LUCA CARDINES - MIDFIELD

The 17-year-old son of well-known former Stevenage Borough forward Colin Cardines, he was on the books at Spartan South Midlands League side Stotfold last season. Luca originally came through Hitchin's youth set-up

FRANCIS MAMPOLO - MIDFIELD

Left-sided midfielder who recently joined the Waders and made his debut in the narrow defeat at Hitchin Town. Recently Francis has been trialling with Newcastle United's under 23s.

HARRY LODOVICA - MIDFIELD/FORWARD

Attacking midfielder who recently joined the Waders from Kempston Rovers. Harry has a muchneeded physical presence on the pitch and made his debut for the club in the 1-1 draw with Nuneaton Borough. Has been playing as a striker in his first few games for the Waders.

JACK VASEY - FORWARD

Signed for the Waders in late 2021 from Welwyn Garden City to provide additional options upfront. Seriously injured at Hitchin Town recently which means Joe's season is now unfortunately over.

LEON OKUBOYEYO - FORWARD

A former Reading apprentice who has played at Hitchin Town. On his way back from a long term injury, Leon is an exciting wide player. Appearances for the Waders so far are limited by injuries.

FINLAY JOHNSON - FORWARD

Son of former Crystal Palace, Everton and Fulham striker, Andy Johnson, Finlay brings explosive pace to the Waders' front line and joins from Stevenage on a work experience loan. Finlay has already made the bench of Stevenage's first team in the EFL and has a bright future ahead. Very sharp goal poacher with an excellent goal to game ratio this season.

GEORGE DEVINE - FORWARD

George spent a short time at Waders under Lee Allinson and has gathered experience at other clubs including Hendon and Hemel Hempstead. George has an eye for goal and rejoins from Colney Heath.

LIAM SMYTH - FORWARD

Joined Waders on loan from Wingate and Finchley. Liam has played for Stevenage (becoming the youngest first-team debutant at age 18) and Braintree Town as well as representing Northern Ireland at under-19 level. Scored twice in his first home game for the Waders against Needham Market.
