However, a dreadful run of results saw us slip to 4th from bottom of the table and with the goals drying up too, a change was made when we said goodbye to the management team of Gary Smith, Andrew Danylyszn and Tom Bailey. It was a disappointing end for them following two successful seasons that had been ended early, twice, due to the pandemic.

Andy Peaks arrived from AFC Rushden and Diamonds, along with Neil Champelovier and Tom Chapman. To say there has been a turnaround would be a big understatement! The team has worked hard, played some great football and the goals are flowing. The management team have built a solid foundation to target a promotion spot next season.

We wish to thank our supporters for their patience this season and the turn out at Hednesford was testament to the great support we have here at Tamworth FC. We were treated to some great goals and the 3 - 2 win was thoroughly deserved, quickly followed by an enjoyable 3 - 1 victory on Thursday evening over Biggleswade Town.

It's fair to say that Andy Peaks has enjoyed a very successful start to his Tamworth FC career. Going on a 13 games unbeaten run and sitting in 9th place in the table, a top 10 finish was not on the cards when he arrived in early February. Tamworth were fighting at the wrong end of the table and had only scored 5 goals in the previous 13 league games. Since the departure of the previous management team in the last 13 games we have picked up 25 points and scored 29 goals. A glance at the current



form table sees Tamworth comfortably sitting in the play - off positions.

Andy is very level-headed in his assessment of the progress made and how the squad has responded "We have got ourselves into a situation where as much as we want to win every game or drop points we want to look at people. "I am delighted at the people who have come in when we have had to make changes. "All the players have shown great spirit and determination, and if you don't have that spirit you don't turn round games, such as the one at Hednesford. "Of course I want to try and win every game, but it is not about me or records, it was about us turning the club round and getting to be where we want to be. "We look at the positives that have been brought to the table over the past few months. not just the management but the players too. "I said when I arrived that there are some good players here and we have proved that. "Of course I want to win on Saturday, no one wants to get beat on the last day of the season! "St Ives play on 3G and they have had some good results recently, but we will be up for it and we want to finish the season off in style."

# THE CHANGING FACE OF THE LAMB



Since the start of last season there have been some big changes at the Lamb which you can't help but spot. The 9 ageing and second hand floodlight columns have been replaced by 4 brand new state of the art LED floodlight towers. The lights are brighter and cheaper to run, and with the facility to dim them, they are suitable for use in a number of different situations.

Another major change is the investment in the clubhouse, identifiable by the refurbished roof and a redeveloped internal space following considerable damage caused by the winter weather. All in all just over £250,000 has been invested in the ground with a substantial amount provided by grants from the Football Stadia Improvement Fund and the generosity of supporters and backers of the club.

Since 2016 the Lamb has moved from a facility that was used two nights a week and a Saturday afternoon to a seven-days-a-week all year-round operation. The club has grown from one competitive team to 25 teams ranging from under-7s to the first team. There is also a full-time scholarship programme for 60 students aged 16-19. A women's section has been introduced with junior and adult teams. As a result, Tamworth FC is now the largest multiteam football club in the area with our academy in a partnership with Derby County.

The Football Stadia Improvement Fund (FSIF) is the largest funder of non-league football in the country. The FSIF is the sister organisation of the Football Foundation and is solely funded by the Premier League. It is the country's largest provider of grants towards projects that help improve the comfort and safety of lower-league football grounds in both the professional and amateur game. These improvements range from new football stands and turnstiles to floodlighting and improved provision for disabled supporters.

# TODAY'S VISITORS

St Ives Town FC was formed on Thursday 15th September 1887. About 40 people met at the Unicorn Hotel to "consider the desirability of forming a football club". It was unanimously decided to form a club, to be called St Ives Town FC under Association Rules. The membership subscription decided upon was 3 Shillings & Sixpence including an entrance fee of 1 Shilling to be paid in advance. The kit was chosen to be black with a white star.

The club rose to success by the turn of the century, collecting both Huntingdonshire Senior and Junior Cups in 1901. The Senior Cup was won again in 1912 but the club's most successful era was the twenties. The Cambridgeshire League was won on three successive occasions from 1923 to 1925, there were Hunts Senior Cup successes in 1923 and 1926 with the Scott-Gatty Cup won in 1923 and 1924. Honours continued to be won in the thirties with the Senior Cup (1930), Scott-Gatty Cup (1932) and Peterborough League championship (1938) all won.

In 1949 the Saints joined the far-flung Central Amateur League, However 12 months later the club decided to move into the much more local UCL 2nd Division. The team struggled and two years later they rejoined the Peterborough League.

The Scott-Gatty Cup was won in 1961 but league fortunes plummeted as the Saints slid down to the Peterborough League 3rd Division. They won that division in 1978 and then won speedy promotions in the following years. This culminated with a Division One title earning a Premier Division place in 1982. Three years later St Ives moved back into the UCL.

Huntingdonshire Senior Cup successes were recorded in 1982, 1987 and 1988 while the revival of the Premier Cup saw the Saints reach the first final in 1989, losing 3-0 to Cambridge United. They also reached the Premier Cup final in 1997 and 1998, losing 5-4 to Potton and 2-1 to Biggleswade Town respectively.

After finishing next to bottom in Division One in 2002, St Ives enjoyed improved fortunes under the management of Warren Everdell and Jez Hall. A memorable 2004/05 campaign saw the Saints finish third in Division One to win promotion to the top flight for the first time in their history.

# **Modern History**

2007/08 Produced another record breaking season with the clubs highest pyramid finish, pushing for promotion but fell just short with a 5th place finish. The highlight of the season the run in the FA Vase which saw a 5th round tie at home to Needham Market produce a thrilling 3-3 draw which was witnessed by a then record 767 crowd. This was only beaten eight years later when it was almost doubled by the play-off final. Sadly the run ended in the replay a week later.

**2008/09** was again a very successful season for the club, reaching the 5th round of the FA Vase for the second year running, coming 6th in the UCL Premier, and reaching the league cup semi final. The club reached all three county cup finals, but unlike 2006/07, the team picked up two winners trophies, in the Senior and Premier Cup, losing the final of the Hinchingbrooke Cup thus stopping another remarkable treble.

**2009/10** saw the Saints once again getting to the fifth round of the FA Vase, before falling at the same hurdle for the third year running. On the domestic front, the Saints won the UCL League Cup for the first time in the clubs history beating Newport Pagnell Town 2-1 in the final. During the season Saints longstanding Co Managers Warren Everdell and Jez Hall reached their 400 game milestones in charge at Westwood Road.

**2010/11** The Saints once again progressed through to the Hunts Senior Cup final but were beaten by League champions; St Neots Town. Also for the second year running they appeared in the final of the League KO Cup but were beaten by the 'up and coming' Peterborough Northern Star. A final league position of 11th and one of the highlights in the FA Vase was beating last year's finalists Wroxham FC away from home with a late goal from Dan Moyes.

**2014/15** saw the new management team of Ricky Marheineke, formerly of Huntingdon and Histon and Jack Cassidy, also from Histon take over the First Team squad. The duo re-shuffled the squad bringing in new faces. During this adjustment results slipped, however the second half of the season saw the Saints climb the table and finished a very respectable 9<sup>th</sup> position.



# ..to the present day



**2015/16** saw the team exceed all expectations by achieving promotion to step 3 of the football pyramid for the first time in their history. The feat was achieved in the most exciting fashion possible via the play offs after finishing a creditable fourth place. Having won their play-off semi-final on penalties at Egham they followed up with a final victory against the mighty Rushden & Diamonds in front of a bumper crowd of over 1500 at the Pro-Edge Stadium. A late Danny Watson equalizer topped off by a winner from local lad Ben Seymour-Shove in extra time finished off a fantastic season in the best possible way.

**2016/17** saw the team consolidate at step 3 with a creditable fifteenth place finish. This was topped off by a successful run in the League Challenge Cup where, an injury ravaged side, were unlucky to lose in the final to Hayes & Yeading United. The lves were dumped out of the FA Cup at the first hurdle by the now famous Westfields. But they enjoyed their best ever run in the FA Trophy getting to the third qualifying round before falling to a single goal at Kings Lynn Town.

**2017/18** turned out to be a tough season for the lves with the team eventually finishing twenty second and only being saved from the drop by the reorganization of the Leagues. Early exits from the FA Cup and Trophy only added to the team's difficulties as on to many occasions they failed to turn promising displays into points. On a happier note the Ladies side of the Club continued their fantastic run of success with the first team winning the Cambridgeshire Women's Premier League to win themselves promotion into the Eastern Women's Regional

**2018/19** saw the Ives surprise a few as they enjoyed their most successful season ever finishing thirteenth in a very competitive Southern League Premier Division Central. League success was topped off with a best ever run in the FA Cup which culminated in a trip to the once mighty York City in third qualifying round. The Ladies success continued as the marched on to the Premier Division of Eastern Region Women's League one step from the National League.

**2019/20 & 2020/21** turned into season's that did not exist after the Coronavirus pandemic lead to early curtailments of both of them.

**2021/22** Ricky and his new assistant, brother Gary, recruited well in the summer ahead of a hopefully successful season.

took the club to a ninth place finish in Southern League Division One Central beating the previous year's points tally, and in his second season secured a memorable promotion, guiding The Ives to a play-off extra time win over AFC Rushden & Diamonds. In his first season at step 3 he continued to take the Club forward finishing a creditable 15th in the Premier Division also enjoying a run to the League Challenge Cup Final which unfortunately ended in defeat. A tough season in 2017/18 was followed in 2018/19 by the Clubs most successful season ever finishing



13th. He is now looking to continue taking the Club forward with a top half finish the minimum aim.

# Mike Ford - Joint Manager

Hugely experienced ex professional footballer Mike has joined the Ives in November 2021 as

a joint manager working alongside existing manager Ricky Marheineke. Having enjoyed sixteen years as a successful player with Cardiff City where he made almost 200 appearances over two stints and Oxford United where he clocked up almost 300 matches. Mike began his managerial career in a caretaker role at Oxford United in 2000 before going on to successfully manage Oxford City for five years including winning promotion to Conference South with the Hoops in 2011/12 season. After leaving Marsh Lane at the end of 2013/14 season he then



took a break before returning to the hot seat at Banbury United where he also took the Puritans to promotion in his first season with the club. Leaving the club at the end of 2019/20 season he has again taken a break from the game before returning to it again hopefully raring to go with the lves.

Eddie Brearey - Goalkeeper - Highly rated seventeen year old Eddie has joined the Ives on an initial one month work experience Ioan from League One Oxford United.

James Goff - Goalkeeper - Ex Northampton Town goalkeeper James is a familiar face to Ives supporters having spent a large part of 2017/18 season as first choice keeper at Westwood Road. Since his release from the Cobblers has spent spells at Wisbech Town, Spalding United and most recently Lincoln United.

Callum Milne - Defender - 25 year old Callum spent six years on the books of Premier League Aston Villa as a youngster having started his career with Northampton Town.. He joins the Ives from Harborough Town having also had spells with Kettering Town, Eynesbury Rovers. Wisbech Town and Bedford Town.

Kyle Davison-Gordon - Defender - Former Luton Town youngster Kyle also spent three years on a soccer scholarship in America at University of Houston-Victoria.



Ben Toseland - Defender/Midfield - Young defender/defensive midfielder Ben is no stranger to Westwood Road having enjoyed a successful loan spell with the lves from Southern League Central rivals Kettering Town in 2018-19 season.

Brett Solkhon - Defender - Kettering Town legend Brett joined the Ives in summer 2020 after completing well over 500 games for the Poppies over three separate spells with them scoring over 120 goals during that period. (pictured right)



Callum Westwood - Defender - Full back Callum has joined the Ives from Southern League Premier Central rivals Stratford Town.

Josh Flanagan - Defender - 18 year old first year professional Josh is on loan to the lves from Northampton Town. He is a product of the Cobblers very successful academy set up.

Oran Jackson - Defender - 23 year old Oran joined MK Dons academy at a young age, progressing through various age groups and into the club's development squad.

Ben Watt - Defender - Right sided defender Ben has joined the Ives on loan from League One Oxford United for the rest of the season.

Fayed Rhaman - Defender - 17 year old full back Fayed is currently studying on lves scholarship programme

Dylan Williams - Midfield - Cambridgeshire lad Dylan spent his formative years in the academy at Cambridge United eventually winning himself a professional contract.

Nathan Hicks - Midfield - Exciting midfielder Nathan learnt his trade at Premiership Leicester City and has more recently been an integral part of the rise of AFC Rushden & Diamonds.

Edmund Hottor - Midfield - Ed is a 27 year-old Ghanaian midfielder who made three senior appearances for Italian side Triestina before joining AC Milan in January 2010.

Michael Richens - Midfield - 26 year old midfielder Michael started his career in the youth system at Peterborough United. before arriving at Kettering Town in 2017 where he became club captain and lead the Poppies to promotion.

Jordan Patrick - Defender / Midfield - Former Cambridge United professional Jordan who can operate as a wide player or full back has a wealth of knowledge. His other former Clubs include Bury Town, Bedford Town, Needham Market and St Neots Town

Luke Fairlamb - Midfield / Striker - Experienced 27-year-old Luke has joined the Ives this summer. He was originally a youth team player with Corby Town prior to moving to the United States to play college football

Liam Cross - Midfield - Energetic attacking midfielder Liam is another first year professional at Northampton Town enjoying his second loan spell with the lves having scored four goals during his earlier spell at Westwood Road.

Tyrone Baker - Winger - Wide midfield player Tyrone has joined the Ives in November 2021 from Isthmian North Division side Basildon United.

Victor Aiyelabola - Midfield - Victor is another recent recruit to Westwood Road having joined the Ives in January 2022 from Isthmian League South East side Whitstable Town.

Ty Ward - Midfield - Combative midfielder Ty will be a familiar face to fans at Westwood Road having played 35 games for the Ives over the 2018/19 and 2019/20 seasons

Faris Rhaman - Midfield - 17 year old attacking central midfielder Faris is studying on the clubs scholarship programme.

Elliot Kettle - Midfield - American born central midfielder Elliot graduated from the academy at Major League soccer club Chicago Fire.

Andrew Osei-Bonsu - Midfield / Striker - Creative midfielder Andrew joined MK Dons academy at the age of eight and progressed through their age groups all the way to making his first team debut in the EFL Cup at Newport County in August 2016.

Nabil Shariff - Striker - Prolific striker Nabil began his career as a scholar at the now defunct Rushden & Diamonds during their conference days amongst his previous clubs he was once a Lamb, making his debut for then boss Marcus Law in August 2011 in the Conference National. (pictured right)



Ethan Johnston - Striker - Recent recruit from Southern League Premier Central rivals Banbury United Ethan successfully worked his way through the Northampton Town academy to earn himself a professional contract at Sixfields.

Nehemiah Richard-Noe - Striker - 18 year old Cambridge United academy graduate Richard is currently on a one year contract with Ives local rivals St Neots Town

EASTER TIME usually means two things for us at NLP Towers...a bumper Bank Holiday double header and the National Game Awards.

The agony and ecstasy of this season's run-in still needs to be settled, but the Buildbase NGAs don't necessarily wait for the trophies to be lifted before honouring its winners. As you read this, we are already putting our plans in place for the big day and part of our job is to give you everything you need to know for when you feel ready to cast your vote. One of the biggest awards on show are the ones for our star men; the Our Game Football Player of the Year, the Step 3-4 Player of the Year and the Sportsbeat Young Player of the Year – all back after a season away due to the Covid hiatus. We certainly don't envy you decision-makers when it comes to picking the person who takes the crown this year! Player of the Year, remember, is an award which covers every player numbered two and above from the National League and the National League North and South – goalkeepers have their own separate NGA – and there's plenty to choose from. Rightly or wrongly, when picking any Player of the Year, the mind naturally often drifts towards the top of the scoring charts with the golden boys up and down the country grabbing the gongs as well as the goals. It doesn't have to be that way of course but the net finders have certainly set the tone for another thrilling season at Steps 1 and 2.

Chesterfield's Kabongo Tshimanga still leads the top-flight scoring charts with 24 goals despite suffering a fractured leg and dislocated ankle in mid-February. And he is being hotly-pursued by Wrexham sharp shooter Paul Mullin, who has netted 22 in just 31 games for the Dragons. FC Halifax Town's Billy Waters, Notts County's Ruben Rodrigues and Michael Cheek, of Bromley, have also shone up top - there's plenty of big guns to pick from. But it's not always just the strikers who stand out, however. Centre-back Ash Palmer and midfield pair Will Collar and Ryan Croasdale have led Stockport County's rampant title charge, while the likes of Halifax's Matt Warburton and Boreham Wood's Will Evans have also marshalled stellar campaigns. How about the likes of Brackley Town skipper Gaz Dean, Kidderminster's Omari Sterling-James and Gateshead's Greg Olley who have shone in National League North, or, likewise, Dorking's Alfie Rutherford, Maidstone's Juan Luque and Hungerford's Ryan Seager in the South. In Step 3-4, the headline makers are primarily those hit find the onion bag week-in, week-out – and this year's goal-getters are again in the running. In the NPL Premier, Whitby Town's Jacob Hazel leads the way with 25, as you read this, while Stamford's Jonny Margetts has 31 goals to his name in NPL Midlands, while Marske United's Adam Boyes and Runcorn Linnets' Ryan Brooke lead to the way in the East and West respectively. Southern top dogs include Coalville's Tim Berridge, Hayes & Yeading's Moses Emmanuel, AFC Dunstable's Bernard Christie and Paulton Rovers's Leighton Thomas, while, in the Isthmian, Ollie Pearce, of Worthing, and Enfield's Mo Faal are top-guns in the Premier, with Bracknell's Seb Bowerman, Brentwood's Tom Richardson and Ramsgate's Josh Ajayi also topping their divisional charts. The choice, as always, is yours, so get your votes in and give your club's star man the recognition he deserves.

To be eligible for the Sportsbeat Young Player of the Year award, the nomination must be 23 years old or under – and again there's plenty of candidates to choose from. Jordan Davies will naturally start as one of the favourites after a superb season in the heart of Wrexham's star-studded midfield. His dynamism and habit for scoring crucial late goals has led the Dragons' league and Trophy double bid.

Solihull Moors' Joe Sbarra is another who has enjoyed a breakthrough year, similarly the two Joshs; Kelly, at Maidenhead, and Barrett, at King's Lynn Town. Charley Kendall has already been snapped up after 22 goals at Eastbourne Borough prompted a move to League One Lincoln City. He is back on loan at Priory Lane and still tearing up National League South. And there's plenty to choose from in the North; Gateshead's Cedwyn Scott, Alfreton's Bailey Hobson and Brackley's Louis Lomas to name but three. And how about Ollie Tanner, who famously turned down a dream move to Tottenham Hotspur to help steer Lewes' promotion campaign? Non-League remains a hotbed of young guns, so if your club has a starlet that deserves to be rewarded then have your say and let us know!

# NON LEAGUE ROUND-UP

It's the final day of the season today with matters still to be decided at both ends of the table.

The Championship Trophy was presented to Banbury United on Easter Monday ahead of their 2-1 win against play-off chasing Alvechurch. Another excellent crowd of 1,349 saw Banbury come back from being a goal down in the 37th minute scored by Jamie Willetts to win, courtesy of Jack Stevens 7 minutes into the second half and Chris Wreh 15 minutes from time.

The other issue settled on Monday was confirmation of Lowestoft Town's relegation after a crowd of 485 at Crown Meadow saw Suffolk rivals Needham Market win 1-0 with a goal from Harvey Sayer 10 minutes into the second half.

Hitchin Town now possess that third-from-bottom play-off spot after they were beaten 1-0 at the Bee Arena by second-placed Peterborough Sports. It was a little tough on the Canaries on the day as Jordan Macleod's goal just after the hour-mark condemned them to defeat. It cam on the back of a really good performance at Banbury United on Saturday where they were also unlucky to lose.

Barwell lifted themselves two points clear of Hitchin after winning the 'six-pointer' at Liberty Way against neighbours Nuneaton Borough, who are level on points with the Hertfordshire side. In front of a crowd of 858, Nuneaton suffered a massive blow after just 7 minutes when they had skipper Scott McManus shown a straight red card for an off-the-ball incident with Barwell striker Ben Stephens. Stephens then went on to give the visitors a 24th -minute lead. Boro were reduced to nine-men on 81 minutes due to an injury, having used all their substitutes, and Tyler Haddow made sure with a second for the Canaries from distance.

Bromsgrove Sporting still can't totally relax after drawing 1-1 in front of 807 at the Victoria Ground against Stratford Town, whose Brennan Denness Barrett cancelled out Matthew Barnes-Homer's 27th minute penalty in the 37th minute.
